

## What is church? Church is an assembled group of people saved (called out) by God who:

- 1. Hear, read, study, memorize, meditate, proclaim, and do the Word of God.
- 2. Practice the Ordinances of the body of Christ (Baptism & The Lord's Supper).
- 3. Are accountable to one another for Holy Living and the Great Commission.

What makes a group of people a church? (How is a church different from any other group of people on the planet?)

• The Biblical functions of church make a group of people the church:



What has the church been devoted to since the beginning of the church? Teaching the Scriptures. (Acts 2:41-47)

What did Jesus tell the church to teach? The Scriptures. (Matt. 28:18-20)

What did Jesus teach? The Scriptures (The Old Testament) and His Words and actions became the four Gospels and part of Acts. (Luke 24:27; 32; 44-49; Mark 12:24)

What did Paul teach? The Scriptures and many of his letters became the rest of the New Testament. (1 Cor. 15:1-11)

What does the Bible instruct the church to teach? All of Scripture. The Old Testament and the New Testament. (2 Tim. 3:16-17)

Does the Bible connect the Old and New Testament? YES. HEBREWS explains how God spoke through prophets (OT) but now He speaks through His Son (the Word made flesh). Hebrews 1:1-4 (ESV)

Who teaches the Word? The people who hear the Word are to teach it. (Hebrews 2:1-3)

## How do you hear the Word?

- Open your heart, your eyes, and your ears. (Heb. 3:7-9, 2 Cor. 3:14-18;
  Psalm 119:18; Prov. 22:17-19)
- Eat the Word. (Jeremiah 15:16)

Why does the Word of God work in us? (Heb. 4:12-13)

- 1. <u>Living</u> The Word is alive. (John 1:1-4, 14; Matt. 5:18)
- 2. Active The Word is actively working. (Psalm 19:7-11)
- 3. Sharper than any two edged sword. (Eph. 6:17)
- 4. Pierces to the division of soul and of spirit. (1 Thess. 5:23; Ezek. 18:4; Matt. 16:26)
- 5. Discerning the mind and the emotions. (Psalm 139:1-3, Psalm 19:12; 1 John 3:20)
- 6. Sees everything in its path (Bright flood light). (Psalm 119:1-5; Psalm 19:1-6)
- 7. Exposes every detail of our lives (x-ray vision). (Mark 4:21-24; Psalm 119:105) When you read the Bible, the Bible reads you.

## How do we teach the Bible?

- Hear, read, study, memorize, meditate, proclaim, and do the Word of God.
- Don't focus on building your hearers. Focus on building your ears for God's Word.
