<u>What is church</u>? Church is an assembled group of people saved (called out) by God who:

- 1. Hear, read, study, memorize, meditate, proclaim, and do the Word of God.
- 2. Practice the Ordinances of the body of Christ (Baptism & The Lord's Supper).
- 3. Are accountable to one another for Holy Living and the Great Commission

What makes a group of people a church? (How is a church different from any other group of people on the planet?)



What has the church been devoted to since the beginning of the church? The Lord's Supper and Accountability. (Acts 2:41-47)

WHAT IS THE LORD'S SUPPER? God's Word on The Lord's Supper

- Matthew 26:26-28
- 1 Corinthians 11:23-34

When a *created* being, who is *fallen* and has been *redeemed*, participates in the Supper by eating the body of Christ and drinking the blood of Christ the good work of atonement and *restoration* is being proclaimed to all who participate and look on.

Lord's Supper Quick Facts:

- The Lord Jesus exhorted His followers to practice the Supper often.
- Paul called the practice "the Lord's Supper".
- Other names are Eucharist ("thanksgiving"), Communion ("koinonia/mutual participation"), Sacrament, the Lord's table (1 Cor. 10:17), Breaking of Bread (Acts 2:42)

What the Lord's Supper is not:

- The real presence of Christ's body and blood (John 6, Matt. 22:19)
- Efficient to impart grace (John 6:35)
- Sustaining for salvation (Eph. 2:8-10)
- Requiring a perfect life in order to take the Supper (1 Cor. 11:27)

What is happening during the Lord's Supper?

- 1. Commemoration/Remembrance of the <u>death</u> of Christ (Luke 22:19)
 - a. This is a "remembrance and <u>reenactment</u>" of paying the penalty of our sin.
- Proclamation of the <u>saving</u> work of Christ's given body and shed blood. (1 Cor. 11:26)
 a. Proclamation looks back at Christ's <u>death</u> & <u>resurrection</u>.
- Celebration the <u>resurrection</u> of Christ and <u>victory</u> over sin and death. (1 Cor. 15:54-57)
 - **a.** Celebrating the <u>triumph</u> of Christ over the <u>power</u> of sin, death, and Satan.
- 4. Anticipation the <u>return</u> of Christ. (1 Cor. 11:26)
 - Anticipation looks forward to the coming <u>Kingdom</u> of God (Rev. 21). Celebrating the past and future in the present as we anticipate the marriage <u>supper</u> of the <u>Lamb</u>. (Rev. 19:6-9)
- 5. Participation in the body of Christ. (1 Cor. 10:16)
 - a. The physical body of Christ the one who saves us
 - b. The gathered body of Christ the one that refines us

Accountability in the Supper: We should be grateful for the grace of God often.

- Gratitude is the attitude that sets the altitude for living. Am I grateful?
- The church practices the Lord's Supper.

How do I make gratitude the theme of the Lord's supper?

Five Looks: Look Within, Look Around, Look Back, Look Ahead, Look Up.
