

## What is church? Church is an assembled group of people saved (called out) by God who:

- 1. Hear, read, study, memorize, meditate, proclaim, and do the Word of God.
- 2. Practice the Ordinances of the body of Christ (Baptism & The Lord's Supper).
- 3. Are accountable to one another for Holy Living and the Great Commission

What makes a group of people a church? (How is a church different from any other group of people on the planet)?

• The Biblical functions of church make a group of people the church:



What has the church been devoted to since the beginning of the church? Fellowship. (Acts 2:41-42)

<u>What is fellowshipu</u> Koinōnia - fellowship, partnership, participation, communion, sharing.

Two aspects of Christian Fellowship: with God and with the church (Genesis 1:26-28)

- What fellowship does:
  - Give and receive love (God blessed them)
  - Be conformed into God's image (be fruitful) (Col. 3:10, Rom. 8:28-29)
  - Make disciples (multiply) (John 13:35)

### Being image bearers of God implies fellowship in 4 relationships:

- 1. A love for God and for what God loves (Matt. 22:37-38)
- 2. A love for one another (Matt. 22:39)
- 3. A love for self (Matt. 22:39)
- 4. A Love for God's creation (Gen. 2:15-18)

# Two practices of Christian Fellowship: large group and small groups (Acts 2:43-47; Psalm 133)

- "Attending the temple" large group teaching
- "Breaking bread in their homes" small group application
- "Day by day" we share LIFE (spiritual, emotional, physical, economical)

### Why is fellowship needed?

- 1. We were made for fellowship with God and each other (see above). (Romans 14:7)
- 2. We have an enemy who wants to destroy us. (1 Peter 5:8-11; John 10:10)
  - a. Suffering and persecution increase as the culture increases its hostility toward the church.
  - b. The enemy's tactics to destroy us is to divide us and isolate us.
- 3. Sin thrives in isolation. (Ecclesiastes 4:9-12)
- 4. We lie to ourselves in isolation. (Proverbs 18:1-2)

### What hinders fellowship? (Colossians 3:1-11)

- Prayerlessness
- Worldliness
- Being quick to anger & quick to speak
- Being insensitive
- Replaying your hurt & refusing to forgive
- Hiding from people

# What helps fellowship? (Colossians 3:12-17)

- Prayerfulness
- Spiritual disciplines & being the church (being set apart)
- Being quick to listen & slow to speak
- Being vulnerable
- Replacing hurt with love & choosing to forgive
- Joining with others for common mission
