## What's Coming Up in Worship

Good news for this time between permanent pastors: rather than hire another full-time, transitional pastor, the Presbytery is allowing Rivermont to hire two part-time, contractual pastors in January 2026:

Rev Dr Paul Rader, the full-time pastor at Northside Presbyterian Church, has agreed to moderate our Session meetings and work with the Mission Study Team. The Mission Study has to be completed before we can form a Pastor Nominating Committee. Both functions have to be done by an ordained pastor, so this will allow us to keep moving forward.

Rev Bill Bond will be our supply preacher. Thank you, Bill!



## Session Updates

### **In recent action, your Session**

- Completed the sale of the Blue House and vacant lot on Black Oak Circle.
- Approved the contract hiring of Dr. Paul Rader to moderate session meetings through our transition period and oversee the Mission Study Team as they write the report for presbytery review.
- Approved the contract hiring of Rev Bill Bond to preach as our regular pulpit supply through our transition period, and requesting presbytery to authorize him to serve communion as designated by the session.
- Approved communion in 2026 to be offered on the first Sunday of each month and on Maundy Thursday.
- Heard report from Buildings & Grounds that atrium roof is fixed and new skylights have been installed.
- Established an ad-hoc committee to pursue loan options from presbytery to assist with HVAC repair/replacement costs.


# The Nutcracker Christmas Carol
