### A Letter from our Session

Dear Rivermont Family,

On behalf of the session, I want to assure you that although we do not have a transitional pastor at the moment, the life and mission of Rivermont church continues! We still have worship, Sunday School and youth activities on Sundays. During the week, musicians and singers rehearse, Presbyterian Women, Bible studies and other groups meet, the office staff keeps daily operations going and the session's prayerful work continues. It's business as usual in many ways, and that's good news in a time of transition.

Looking ahead, we do need a transitional pastor and our General Presbyter Rev. Dr. Wendy Neff, asked me to tell you that we have presbytery's full support in this. She is already seeking the right person for the job and hopes to have someone in 6 to 8 weeks. In the meantime, she will moderate our session meetings, and we're relying on Tripp Harvey, our Committee on Ministry liaison, as our go-to resource for guidance on the transition process. We are so grateful for their support!

The process of searching for a long-term pastor continues as well. In our eight months with Rev. Julie Thompson, she helped us document accurate information about our church membership and finances, started the Mission Study Team on their work, and improved several processes and reporting practices. Those important actions laid the foundation for our next phase. We give thanks to God for her gifts and pray for God's continued blessings and light on her path as goes from here.

Having completed these first transitional steps, we joyfully shift our focus to the future God intends for us as we work together to build His kingdom. Rivermont has long been a faithful and welcoming fellowship that seeks to be the hands and feet for our Lord. Over the years, this church has lovingly opened its doors and its arms to many in need. That is an extraordinary legacy that is desperately needed in today's hurting, chaotic, and fractious world. Discerning where God is calling us to go next is part of what the Mission Study Team is wrestling with now as they develop the document that will define us to potential called pastor candidates. The transition pastor will help complete that task and walk with us through the rest of the process.

Most transitions are somewhat unsettling, and the road in our transition has been more winding and challenging than we expected. But Rivermont is God's church, and we are God's beloved community. We trust Him to continue to hold us in His hands now and in the future as together we continue to be faithful followers.


## Session Notes

In recent action, your Session:

- Approved a motion to use up to \$2000 from Jordan Fund to support a Hope House intern as we have in the past.
- Appointed a team to conduct a Mission Study and prepare a report for presbytery approval. This step
  is the next milestone before we appoint a Pastor Nominating Committee.
- Endorsed <u>Rivermont's</u> participation in the Chattanooga Pride Festival and encouraged members to attend.
- Established a Financial Review Team to conduct a full review of the church's finances as required in the Book of Order.
- Reviewed repairs/replacement costs of narthex and atrium roof. B&G will present a motion for next meeting.
- Approved funds to replace air handling units serving the chapel, bookstore, library and Seekers Room.
- Appointed a Stewardship Committee to begin work on the fall campaign.
- Received financial reports from Treasurer.
- Approved Child & Youth Protection Policy presented by Children's Ministry.



love, and time itself.



In Wonderland, she meets familiar yet peculiar characters—The White Rabbit, the Florals, the Jacks, the Tweedles, and the Caterpillar—each with their own rules, or "NeverDoos," that highlight the strangeness of her journey.

But the magical landscape is interlaced with the drawing room of Lady Ann Carrolton (Alice's grandmother, "Nonna"), who struggles with memory loss and frailty while recalling friends, loves, and the rules that once defined her life. As reality and imagination blur, Alice's journey becomes not only a fantastical search for her lost smile but also a moving exploration of memory, family bonds, and the whispers of a life well-lived.

## Mission Opportunities

Each month the Mission Ministry at RPC donates time and resources to help those at the CHATT Foundation. What is the CHATT Foundation? They are long time resource for community members who need assistance. They work to "maximize strengths and minimize barriers. They collaborate with community partners and support clients to find housing, clothing, food, and care as well as education, job-skills training, financial literacy and life-skills learning."



What can you do? We offer not only our time but we pack sack lunches each month:
