# Sermon Notes

Ruth 1:1-22 | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the first in our four-week fall series on the Book of Ruth. What looks on the sur-▲ face as a very easy to understand and straightforward story becomes nuanced, deep, and powerfully relevant to our lives and world when pondered culturally, relationally, and theologically. The book, among other things, asks the question: how is God involved in our joys and hardships? The narrator doesn't mention God working directly, but God is clearly at work behind the scenes through circumstances and people. And the result is transformation from empty to full, a turning from wandering to coming home, from barren to fruitful, from hungry to full, from "at risk" to secure in the tribe and God's hands.

- 1. When has life seemed to be against you and those you love? When have you gone from "full" to "empty" in more than one area of your existence? Name some of the negatives and pain and suffering.
- 2. Read Ruth chapter 1. Focus on the first five verses. Name all the bad things that happen to this family. I named at least six things in my sermon. Do you have more than six? I talked about the July 4th flooding of the Guadalupe River and the devastation of so many families. Is it comforting to you or no consolation that Scripture shows that those who follow God are not immune to hardship?
- 3. Read verses 6-18. What does Naomi suggest to her daughters-in-law? Why? Both Orpah and Ruth show agency in one acting reasonably and the other unreasonably. Defend Orpah's decision and Ruth's. Which makes more sense to you?
- 4. I mentioned in my message the Hebrew word, hesed, from verse 8, where it is translated in most versions as "kindness." I suggested that the word describes something fundamental about God and that this word can be embraced/walked out by humans as well. The word means loyalty, covenant faithfulness, sacrificial love. How does Ruth show hesed to Naomi? Can you name times in the Bible or in your life when God has shown *hesed* to you or those around you?
- 5. Read verses 19-22. Naomi blames God for her predicament amid her grief. What hint did I suggest that might provide hope in the midst of grief at the end of chapter 1? And why is it good news that Naomi does not get the last word about her situation, but God does?




