Sermon Notes

Ruth 1:1-22 | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the second in our four-week fall series on how God joins us in the joys and hardships of life and offers us hope. Chapter two of Ruth is divided into three parts: Ruth with Naomi; Ruth in the field with Boaz; and Ruth back with Naomi at the end of the day. The flow moves from desperation to perspiration to inspiration. For those walking through hard times, may we—like Ruth and Naomi—find ourselves brought to the same hopeful conclusion.

- 1. Have you ever faced a moment of physical desperation when you were fiercely hungry, painfully thirsty, or even under attack and your very life was at risk?
- 2. Read Ruth 2:1-23. Part one, as I shared above, includes verses 1-2. What new name is introduced into the story? What do we learn about Boaz? About the relationship between Ruth and Naomi? And what do we learn about Ruth? Why does she try to stave off starvation, but Naomi doesn't?
- 3. Focus on verses 3-17. In chapter one, I suggested that there were at least 7 strikes against Naomi in the first few verses of the chapter. In chapter two, there are at least 7 blessings that Ruth encounters during her hard work in the field. What would your list of blessings be, and why? How does the relationship between Ruth and Boaz change from start to finish? What names do each give to the other? And why are they significant?
- 4. Draw your attention to verses 18-23. How does the news from Ruth about her day begin to change Naomi from being *bitter* to being *sweet* again, from being *empty* to becoming *full* once more? This harvest season for barley and wheat probably lasted around 7 weeks. This gives Ruth and Naomi some short-term relief, but there is still no permanent solution to their plight. Do you think they have their next moves planned?
- 5. I mentioned from verse 20 that the NRSV word 'our nearest kin' is much richer than just being a relative; that the word talks about this person being 'a kinsmen redeemer.' I explained the concept briefly in my message. How does Boaz foreshadow the redemption we can experience through Christ? How can we learn from Ruth and Naomi how to more fully receive the blessings our Savior intends for us as followers?




