Sermon Notes

Ruth 3:1-18 | Written by Rev. Dr. Clay Brown

The focus on God's kindness, from the Hebrew word *hesed*, continues in Ruth chapter three. Only now it does so in unanticipated ways. Naomi is on the way toward recovery from bitterness, but she's not quite there yet, as we'll see in this next phase of the story: Naomi plans, Ruth adapts, and Boaz responds. All brought together by a gracious God, who specializes in taking the fallible plans of flawed humans and turning out His best from them.

- 1. We support marriages, and we especially support the weddings that start the marriages. Clay shows some photos from his and Cathy's wedding in 1980. What are differences between weddings "back in the day" and weddings today? How does MDPC support marriages and the weddings that get them started?
- 2. The romantic, celebratory view of marriages and weddings lauded in the previous question is not at the forefront of Ruth chapter 3. What does Clay say is there instead? How does this realization shape what happens in the rest of the chapter?
- 3. In Ruth 3:1-6, Naomi concocts a plan for Ruth's life and shares it with her. What is noteworthy about this plan? What might be lacking in the plan? How and why are there ambiguities in how the plan is communicated?
- 4. In Ruth 3:7-15, Ruth goes to carry out Naomi's plan, but things change as the plan goes into action. Ruth goes off script and adapts the strategy on the spot. What does she say? What ancient Hebrew practice does Ruth count on? What does Ruth's proposal mean for her and for Boaz?
- 5. Also in Ruth 3:7-15, Boaz responds to the plan as adapted by Ruth. How does his response reflect God's kindness and faithfulness? What touches does Boaz add to the amended plan? What consideration does Boaz show to both Ruth and Naomi?
- 6. In Ruth 3:16-18, Ruth returns home and reports to Naomi. How does Ruth communicate Boaz's response? What is Naomi's counsel?
- 7. To sum up, reflect upon and talk about the comment below from Old Testament scholar Iain Duguid that Clay quotes at sermon's end:

"The story of Boaz and Ruth is not really a love story at all, at least not in the modern sense. It's not a story about boy meets girl, in which both are physically attracted to one another and the rest is a history of passionate kisses and life viewed through a romantic haze... The real love story is behind the scenes. It is the love of God for His straying sheep. It is the love that prevented Him from ending the world when Adam and Eve first sinned. It is the love that chose and called Abraham and then persisted in pursuing his rebellious offspring. It is the love that would not let them go..."

"This love took its fullest shape in the coming of Jesus Christ. His love for us took Him much further than a grain pile at midnight. It caused Him to leave the glories of heaven and come down and live as an ordinary worker... This same love of God took Jesus all the way to the cross. There, in the midst of a darkness far deeper than any ordinary midnight, He offered Himself up for the sins of His people... Why? Is it because we are such wonderful people and we thoroughly deserve it? Certainly not! It is because God was so committed to saving sinners like us, and this was the only way it could be done."
