# Sermon Notes

2 Corinthians 1:12-22 | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the second in our fall series on the second letter of Paul to the Corinthi-**\( \)** ans. In our text for today, we see more clearly the undertones of the accusations the Corinthians were leveling against Paul and the slander with which they were besmirching his name. Here were the accusations in a nutshell: You are committing hidden, negative actions we can't see; you have hidden motives we don't know; there are hidden meanings to what you are saying that we don't understand; and finally, you didn't follow through with your promise to visit. If we can't trust what you say in everyday things like travel commitments, how can we trust what you say about God and the Good News of Jesus Christ?

- 1. How do you respond when your actions or motives are misunderstood or impugned? What do you do if your character is called into question? How do you take the high road but also defend yourself when necessary? How do you know when to defend and when not to defend yourself?
- 2. Read 2 Cor. 1:12-22. How does Paul answer the first three accusations from the opening paragraph in verses 12-14? How does he answer the fourth accusation in verses 15-18? Where might Proverbs 19:21 come in regarding the fourth accusation, as well as the episode of Paul in Acts 16:6-10?
- 3. In verses 19-20, Paul switches gears to talk about the character and actions of Jesus. What is his argument? Have you ever thought of faith being "saying yes to the yes that God has already said to you and our world in Christ"?
- 4. In verses 21-22, how does Paul cap off this section of Scripture? What is his evidence of their authority to speak into the lives of these brothers and sisters? In my message, I talked about what the "seal on us" and "first installment" might be and mean for us as Christians this side of heaven. How does Paul hope those closing thoughts might move his relationship with the Corinthians past accusation to partnership going forward? How do these last two verses remind us about God's ongoing investment in us through Christ?


