Sermon Notes

2 Corinthians 2:14-3:3 NRSV | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the fifth in our fall preaching series on Second Corinthians. Paul had more problems with this church than all the others he started (and served) combined. However, through the conflict and hurt, the Good News of the Gospel is still displayed, and character is forged through fire. We spent two weeks in chapters 8 & 9 to be able to talk about generosity and giving, and now we are back at the end of chapter 2 where the tension is still evident between Paul and the people he is called to serve. How should he respond to the attacks surrounding his authority and his credentials? In Philippians 3, Paul offers his pedigree and resume. Here, he takes a different tack.

- 1. I talked about the idea that human beings experience the world through our senses. Which sense (vision, hearing, tastes, touch, smell) is strongest for you? Which sense triggers the most memories? Share a time when hearing or seeing or smelling something triggered a memory for you.
- 2. In response to the conflict between these two parties, Paul takes an interesting strategy in 2 Cor. 2:14-3:3. In verse 14a, (the first part of the verse), he shares that all of us are on display for our faith. We can't hide. We are on a runway before the world, whether we want to be or not. Why do you think Paul starts his argument there? What advantage do you think he has over his opponents on this point?
- 3. Paul goes on to say in verse 14b (the rest of the verse) through vs. 16 that, as Christians, we take on the aroma of Christ. What do you think he means? What does that aroma smell like?
- 4. I shared three stories about smells revealing where someone had been or what they were doing or where they were employed. Who are some people in your life who have the sweet smell of Christ? How has that "smell" been revealed to you?
- 5. How does verse 17 add to Paul's argument?
- 6. In 2 Cor. 3:1-3, Paul says he has no letters of recommendation for them. He only has the lives of the members of the congregation: the people he has mentored and prayed for and taught and loved. How does the student reveal the teacher? The child the parent(s)? The church the pastors (and ultimately Christ)?
- 7. What do you think people learn about Jesus from your life (public display, scent, actions, and attitudes)?
- 8. What new perfume or fragrance or letter are you adding to your life? How does the Holy Spirit help that happen? (Reading Scripture, joining a small group, taking on some new discipline, praying, serving, etc.?)
