

Sermon Notes

[2 Corinthians 5:11-21](#) | Pastor Alf Halvorson

This is the tenth in our fall sermon series on Paul's second letter to the church in Corinth. Some might say, why are we continuing to study 2 Corinthians during Advent? Shouldn't we be using texts from the Gospels that talk about Jesus' birth and the prophecies from the Old Testament leading up to it? Perhaps. But what 2 Corinthians does is reveal why it was necessary for Christ to come; why we needed a Savior; why humans have wandered away from God; and why we (after receiving help and salvation from Christ through faith) are given the ministry of reconciliation ourselves. We have a purpose as ambassadors of this new creation, this new reality in our world, and this new kingdom in our midst.

- Did your thanksgiving celebration meet expectations or fall flat this year? What do you hope happens in your life and schedule around Christmas this year? And where do you feel the weight of responsibility or expectations surrounding these celebrations?
- Read 2 Cor. 5:11-21. This section contains some very well-known verses and a couple of amazing concepts. One of those is the idea from vs. 17 that in Christ we become new creations. The old is gone; the new is breaking in. Where do you feel you are experiencing new life in Christ? And where do your old habits threaten to drag you back into your old way of life?
- In verses 14-16, Paul suggests the Christian life is motivated by the love of Christ, and that Christ's death on the cross opens up for us a whole different way of life. What is the life he suggests here?
- In verses 18 & 19, Paul says twice that, in response to being reconciled to God through Christ's action paired with our faith, we are then given the ministry/message of reconciliation. What do you think that ministry/message entails?
- I spent the most time in my message on the concept of us being called "ambassadors for Christ, since God is making His appeal through us." Where did my explanation make sense or help you think about your Christian life in a new way? Was there anything unhelpful? Or would you have shared a story or illustration or idea that I didn't cover?
- Finally, verse 21 provides quite an amazing short summary of the purpose of Christ's coming. It is "for us." He is Immanuel, God with us; but He also came with a purpose, to overcome our estrangement with God because of our sin. His goal is to exchange hostility for friendship, change enmity to partnership. How has God through Christ done that in your life? And how are you extending that reconciliation in your life? What questions do you still have about becoming a Christian or living out the Christian faith in the world? Talk to your group, a friend, or a pastor for clarification, closure, and confidence.
