

Sermon Notes

Luke 2:40-52 (NLT) | Written by Rev. Brett Hurst

This fascinating passage highlights Jesus' spiritual growth and early awareness of His divine identity. Verse 40 emphasizes the boy's development—physically strong, spiritually wise, and favored by God—showing that His humanity was genuine and absolute. And yet, the temple scene at age twelve reveals Jesus' extraordinary relationship with the Father. While His parents assume He belongs with them, Jesus prioritizes His Father's business, signaling His mission and identity as God's Son. Their inability to comprehend what is happening reminds us that God's purposes often surpass human expectations. Yet, Jesus models humility by returning to Nazareth and living in obedience, continuing to grow in wisdom and favor. This balance of divine calling and submission offers a profound example of spiritual maturity.

1. What does Luke emphasize by repeating that Jesus “grew” and “became strong” and “increased in wisdom”?
2. Read Luke 2:41-42. Why do you think Luke highlights that Jesus’ family went to Jerusalem every year? What does this tell us about the religious life of Jesus’ household?
3. How was it possible for Mary and Joseph not to notice Jesus missing for a full day? What characteristics about ancient travel might be revealed here?
4. What do the various emotional expressions of Mary and Joseph in this story demonstrate about their own humanity? Do you feel empathy with their lack of understanding in this situation? Why or why not?
5. We know from Jesus’ later ministry how well-versed Jesus was in the Hebrew Scriptures, as well as His devotion to and remarkable understanding of them. Based on this story, are you impressed with the role of questions involved in the overall process of a person’s spiritual development?
6. Read Luke 2:49. What do you think Jesus means by the phrase “My Father’s house” (or “about My Father’s business”)? What is He trying to say?
7. Why do you think Mary and Joseph “did not understand” Jesus’ words? What does this moment teach us about the mystery of God’s calling—even among faithful families?
8. Why is it critical that Jesus returns to Nazareth and that He remains “obedient” to His parents?
9. What do you think it means when it says that Jesus grew in “favor with God and people”? How might that example shape our own spiritual formation?
