

Sermon Notes

2 Corinthians 12:1-10 NRSV | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the second message (post our “Vision to Reality” two-week series) to finish off Paul’s second letter to the church in Corinth. He is still having to defend himself against rival teachers who want the people to reject Paul’s teaching and follow their super-apostle-Gospel-plus-law/circumcision project instead. Paul would rather not engage in this foolish back and forth, but he feels like the Good News of Jesus is in jeopardy if he doesn’t counter these false teachers’ errors. And so he, with great vulnerability and transparency, reveals both the heights he has experienced in Christ (paradise itself) and also the prolonged thorn in the flesh (pain) he prayed would be removed from him but was not removed so that God’s power could be revealed in and through Paul’s weakness.

1. What pains (physical, emotional, relational, and/or spiritual) are you dealing with right now? Are they constant or intermittent? Are they self-inflicted or do they seem to be caused by others, evil, or even God?
2. Read 2 Cor. 12:1-10. This double-faceted passage concludes the fool’s speech section of this letter, combining the loftiest of experiences (a transport into the third heaven) with the lowest (a persistent, unavoidable “thorn/stake in the flesh”). The two stories belong to and interpret each other as demonstrating the extremes a person may experience in life. From 2 Cor. 12:1-7a, have you ever been transported to another realm in the faith (or the palpable presence of God) during worship or prayer or some other time? Have you and God united in an intimacy that is hard to explain? Have you had an experience of grace or wisdom or insight that was so real and transformative that it is hard to talk about or explain? Why do you think that happened to you? And what purpose, if any, does it play in your life now?
3. Why doesn’t Paul exploit this event in his life to overshadow his rivals and get the Corinthians to love him because of this experience?
4. Read 2 Cor. 12:7b-10. Why does Paul say he was given a “thorn in the flesh”? A stake to keep him from being too elated? Why do you think Paul wants people to appreciate his weaknesses over his strengths or ecstatic experiences? What does it mean that the ecstatic just has to be believed or denied (they can’t be subjected to scrutiny), but that the “tried and true” normal experiences from one person to another are a better indication of that person’s faith, love, and real care?
5. I shared a little of my own experiences, high and low, as well as from Rick Warren and Max Lucado to try to help us see the point Paul was attempting to make here. What is your takeaway from this section of Scripture? And how can you see your weaknesses as opportunities for God’s power to be experienced and revealed? Pray for God’s grace to be shared through your weakness; and God’s power to shine through your brokenness.
