# Caring Ministries Committee Minutes: February 20, 2024 Ministry Reports

#### **Card-writing:**

- The Branches group held its monthly meeting in January to send handwritten notes to MDPC members who had been in the hospital/rehab, lost a loved one, or just needed encouragement. They also sent care cards to those who are staying in the MDPC-sponsored apartments in the Medical Center.
- The five dedicated Prayer Chain writers took turns writing to those on the Prayer Chain list.

#### **Community Relations:**

• The **Coming-of-Age Series** concluded with a requested workshop on January 24 entitled "Financial Planning for Now & Later". David Harkins' team from Merrill Lynch were the guest speakers and they shared a wealth of information on financial planning. #### **Dementia and Caregiver Support:**

- The Gathering Place: The Gathering Place, now meeting the first Wednesday of every month, had 8 care partners, 8 caregivers, and 10 volunteers this month. #### **Second Family:**

- Second Family volunteers expended 99 hours to support their care partners during January 2024.
- We currently have 13 care partners and have been busy attending to each care partner's special needs. Visitation of our care partners keeps us very busy each month. Visitation is most beneficial to check on their health and if they need anything. Several care partners are taken on long walks and to lunch every week with long visitations. Others are brought special meals that they could not get for themselves. We take several of our care partners to medical appointments, hair appointments, grocery stores and any other errand they may need assistance with. Older adults who regularly participate in social activities have stronger immune systems and higher life satisfaction. Loneliness increases several mental and physical health risks. Visiting our care partners regularly may help them stay healthy longer. Our care partners are very thankful and happy and that makes it very rewarding for "Second Family".
- Mobile meals are delivered on Mondays and Thursdays of every week, and we now have 5 deliveries with 4 stops.

#### **Senior Adult Ministry:**

- The monthly Senior Adult newsletter was mailed to about 110 families in January and February. The
  newsletter contains descriptions of upcoming activities of Venturers, Encore Fellowship, Prime Timers,
  and Senior Adult Fellowship lunch. Information for Senior events and activities is also online at
  seniors.mdpc.org.
- **Venturers:** The Venturers met and had dinner at Fratelli's on February 5, and 45 heard Dr. Paul Klotman (President of Baylor College of Medicine) talk about the college and its many activities and research. On March 4, we will hear Russ Arnold of the Houston Livestock & Rodeo.

- **Encore Fellowship:** On January 29, the group met at Carrabba's for dinner and socialization. On February 3, 44 attended the Stratford Playhouse production of *42<sup>nd</sup> Street*. On February 24, they plan to go to Houston Botanical Garden to see the Radiant Light Show.
- Prime Timers: On February 21, Prime Timers will go to Galveston to visit the Railroad Museum.
- Senior Adult Fellowship Lunch: The monthly Senior Adult Lunch is held at MDPC to have lunch, meet new friends, and learn more about existing friends. Lunch was held on January 22 (18 attended) and will be held again on February 26. Beginning in March, the lunches will be on the third Monday of each month through August.
- **Special Event:** We are planning to have Lt. Guinn of Precinct 5 make a presentation on August 8. He made a presentation last year on Active Shooter Response. Planning for this event is ongoing.

#### **Stephen Ministry:**

- The Stephen Ministry team met twice in January for supervision and then gathered to participate in the commissioning of Tim Tade as a new Stephen Leader during the 8:30am worship service on February 11.
- A new Stephen Ministry training class began on January 23 and will meet weekly through May 28, for a

#### Approval of minutes

There were no meeting minutes available for December.

#### Reports

Marcus Vajdos presented FYE internal and preliminary financial statements on the projector screen. The statements had just been presented to Marcus, moments prior to the meeting. No hard copies of the FYE statements were available for preview.

Of note was a shortfall in Budgeted Contributions for 2023. There was some confusion about the exact amount due to the preliminary nature of the statements. The apparent shortfall was approximately \$130k.

On the expense side, expenses for the FYE were approximately \$80k over the budgeted amount.

The net budget shortfall was therefore approximately \$210k.

#### Unfinished business

Because of the net Budget shortfall, the FC considered the Session Passed Motion from December 2021 which established a reserve account, having the apparent purpose of supplementing and honoring MDPC's communicated Outreach Giving for the completed year (in this case, 2023) and to protect budgeted labor dollars for the next year. The Reserve Fund was given no name and no changes or edits occurred to MDPC's chart of accounts. The amount of the reserve account fund was set as \$650k. The FC worked to understand how the Motion was intended to function. The FC will do more work to understand the full intent of the Motion and work to understand if policies or rules need to be established to honor 2021 Session's Motion.

It became apparent the net amount of reserves needed to honor budgeted Outreach spending was approximately \$42k. New Business

A Meeting Agenda Template was introduced. The Template was presented to provide a guideline of items that can be/should be considered by the FC.

#### Motion

There was no formal Motion presented, by effective acclamation, the FC decided to recommend to Session the use of \$42k be transferred from the above-mentioned Reserve Fund and used to pay budgeted Outreach Grants.

#### **Announcements**

The Stoney Creek Ranch Retreat for Staff, Elders, and Deacons is set for January 23-24, 2024. The next FC Meeting is set for Monday, February 19, 2024, at 5:15 PM The meeting was closed in Prayer.

Discussed the end of the year shortfall, and Marcus advised the committee that Session voted to fulfill our full 2023 Outreach obligations (approximately \$45K) but noted that that amount would have to be added back into the 2024 budget.

The committee discussed our 2023 committee goals of a 5% increase in pledges (550); and noted that we actually received 602 pledges. Alf posed the question "What is our baseline?" Should we add 10% to that achieved amount or base it off the goal? The committee decided to table this decision until later in the year.

Bill led a discussion regarding this year's theme and put forth a recommendation that we keep the same theme (Team MDPC) as last year and continue to add to and grow that. We mentioned how it could work well with Leadership Transfer (the idea of going from the farm team to the majors, coming in off the bench). All agreed to keep Team MDPC for 2024.

Michael McCormack talked about his role on the Facilities Committee and the importance of keeping abreast of needed improvements to our building and grounds, particularly when asking our members to contribute.

Bill asked if there were any agenda ideas for the upcoming meetings and asked that members let him know what they would like to see addressed.

While considering Fuente and the Brazilian Church's involvement in giving and how to best reach those groups, a member suggested inviting Pastors Almir and Guillermo to a future meeting so that we could all discuss it in person. The committee heartily agreed.

Pastor Alf closed the meeting in prayer.

#### Icebreaker and Reflections:

Edneia commenced the meeting with prayer and led an icebreaker session during lunch. We were delighted to have Amanda (guest from Texas A&M area) and Rachel Poysky join us for this engaging activity. The icebreaker was designed to foster deeper connections within our leadership team through a "get to know you" exercise, encouraging us to share unique aspects of ourselves that others may not be aware of.

#### **Devotional and Character Reflections:**

Sara led a thought-provoking devotional moment, prompting us to reflect on Christ-like characteristics we admire in others, those we possess, and areas we're actively developing. It was a beautiful exchange of insights, **with qualities like** supportiveness, gentleness, openness, vulnerability, and grace highlighted. **We** 

**celebrated our** strengths in empathy, active listening, and loyalty while **acknowledging areas for growth such** as listening, forgiveness, patience, obedience, intentionality, and grace.

#### Rule of Life Review:

Sally facilitated a discussion on our progress with the Rule of Life goals pertaining to work, relationships, prayer, and rest. It was uplifting to hear that overall, the team is enjoying the journey and witnessing positive changes in our relationship with God, including improvements in prayers and rest. We recognized the importance of sharing this experience with our loved ones and the need to adjust our plans and set boundaries to ensure successful implementation. Sally's closing remarks served as a gentle reminder to view the Rule of Life as a guiding resource on our **individual paths** to draw closer to God, reassuring us that it's okay to progress step by step. The goal is to first draw closer to Jesus individually and as a lead team so that we can lead others.

#### Missional Habits and Collective Reflection:

Sally shared insights from the ECO National Conference, particularly on missional habits BELLS (Bless, Eat, Listen, Learn, Sent). The missional habit BELL consist on:

Bless — bless three people — a) nonbeliever, b) believer within MDPC YA community c) a person of your choice — family, friend, neighbor, co-worker...

Eat — Eat a meal with 3 people — a) nonbeliever, b) believer within MDPC YA community c) a person of your choice — family, friend, neighbor, co-worker...

Listen — spend at least one hour this week listening for the Spirit's voice and worshipping God via listening to reflection, meditation. The goal is to quiet yourself to be open to what God is saying.

Learn — spend 1 hour a week reading God's word. This time of learning will help us learn more about Christ but ultimately lead to life transformation. Get in the habit of opening the Bible and reading God's word daily.

**S**ent — Live a life on mission: Love and serve those in your area of influence/circle: pray for them, take time to understanding the needs around us, and then reach out to someone and share the good news/meet a physical need.

We collectively brainstormed ways to incorporate these habits into our lives and ministry to support our development as a Young Adult leadership team. We agreed to kickstart with "B" (Bless) this month, with each team member tasked with blessing 3 individuals (nonbeliever, believer, another person of their choice) with the goal of focusing on building relational connections, learning more about other individual, sharing our stories and God's story (the gospel).
