

SACR AMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Williamsburg Presbyterian Church welcomes all who believe in Jesus Christ to share the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper with us today. We receive the elements by means of intinction, taking a piece of bread and dipping it into the cup. For those who desire an individual serving, regular or gluten free, they will be on a table in front of the baptismal font and on the small tables located in the balcony. If you are seated on the main floor of the sanctuary, you are invited to come forward to the chancel area by way of the center aisle and return to your pews by the side aisle. If you are sitting in the balcony, an usher will guide you to the sacrament. If you are unable to come forward easily, please signal to one of the ushers or elders so the communion elements can be brought to your seat.

>> THIS EVENING'S MUSIC ◆

This evening's organ music features the Canonic Variations on *Vom Himmel Hoch*. The English translation of the hymn, entitled "From Heaven Above, To Earth I Come", can be found on page 111 in the pew hymnal. Bach composed a series of five variations of increasing musical complexity. The first variation opens with a descending scale in the right hand, representing Christ's coming among us. The left hand plays the identical musical line throughout the entire piece, slightly delayed, while the melody appears in the pedal line. The second variation is of similar style, with the left hand mirrors the right hand but starting on a different note. By the fifth variation, the melody appears in all voices in a variety of decorations including inverted (upside down). The closing flourish features six independent musical lines wrapping around Bach's signature motif, spelling his name (B-A-C-H) in the last measure. Bach's genius shines in making this mind-bending composition joyful and appropriate for the season. Want to know how to spell B-A-C-H on a keyboard? Or see the various musical lines interweaving?
