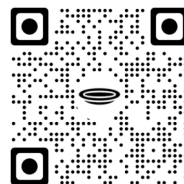
***AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: THE APOSTLES' CREED** (unison)

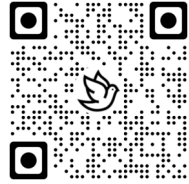




