


## PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE AND THE LORD'S PRAYER (unison)

## ♪ NOTES ABOUT TODAY's MUSIC ♪

"Down in the River to Pray" is a spiritual that dates to the middle of the nineteenth century. The phrase "in the river" (as opposed to "to the river") is significant, as it signifies going into the water for baptism. Like many spirituals, the song is full of references to scripture that also served as guides for those seeking freedom along the Underground Railroad.
