



## > NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ≪

This morning's postlude, whose title is simply translated "Song", is by French organist composer Louis Vierne (1870-1937). Nearly blind since birth, Vierne would go on to become organist at Notre-Dame Cathedral. In addition to a number of *organ symphonies*, Vierne wrote a suite of smaller selections, *Twenty Four Pieces in Free Style*, from which this lovely selection is drawn.
