

#### > NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ≪

Our prelude today is played by two members of the Presbybop quintet, Bill Carter and Michael Carbone. Presbybop will be presenting a concert this evening as part of the Open Door Concert Series, and we are grateful to have Bill and Michael to be part of worship today.

Bill and Michael will also accompany the chancel choir on our offertory anthem, "Jesus Loves Me." The anthem was arranged by Michael Hassell for WPC's former pastor Neil Stevenson on the occasion of his retirement in 1995. When asked to name his favorite hymn, Rev. Stevenson responded that, after many years of ministry, this Sunday-school song still moved him deeply. In this arrangement, Hassell sought to revive "Jesus Loves Me" for adult listeners, and wrote a more mature accompaniment. In his notes on the piece, he says, "While the choir sings, saxophone and piano trade blues phrases interspersed with snatches of a children's chant that no one could miss." Hassell presented this anthem as "a tangible demonstration of God's eternal capacity to work miracles, particularly little ones."

This morning's postlude, by North Carolina composer, Dan Locklair, is a playful dialogue between different voices of the pipe organ. Its repeating melody is built on the octatonic scale, a musical pattern that offers a sense of restlessness and unease.
