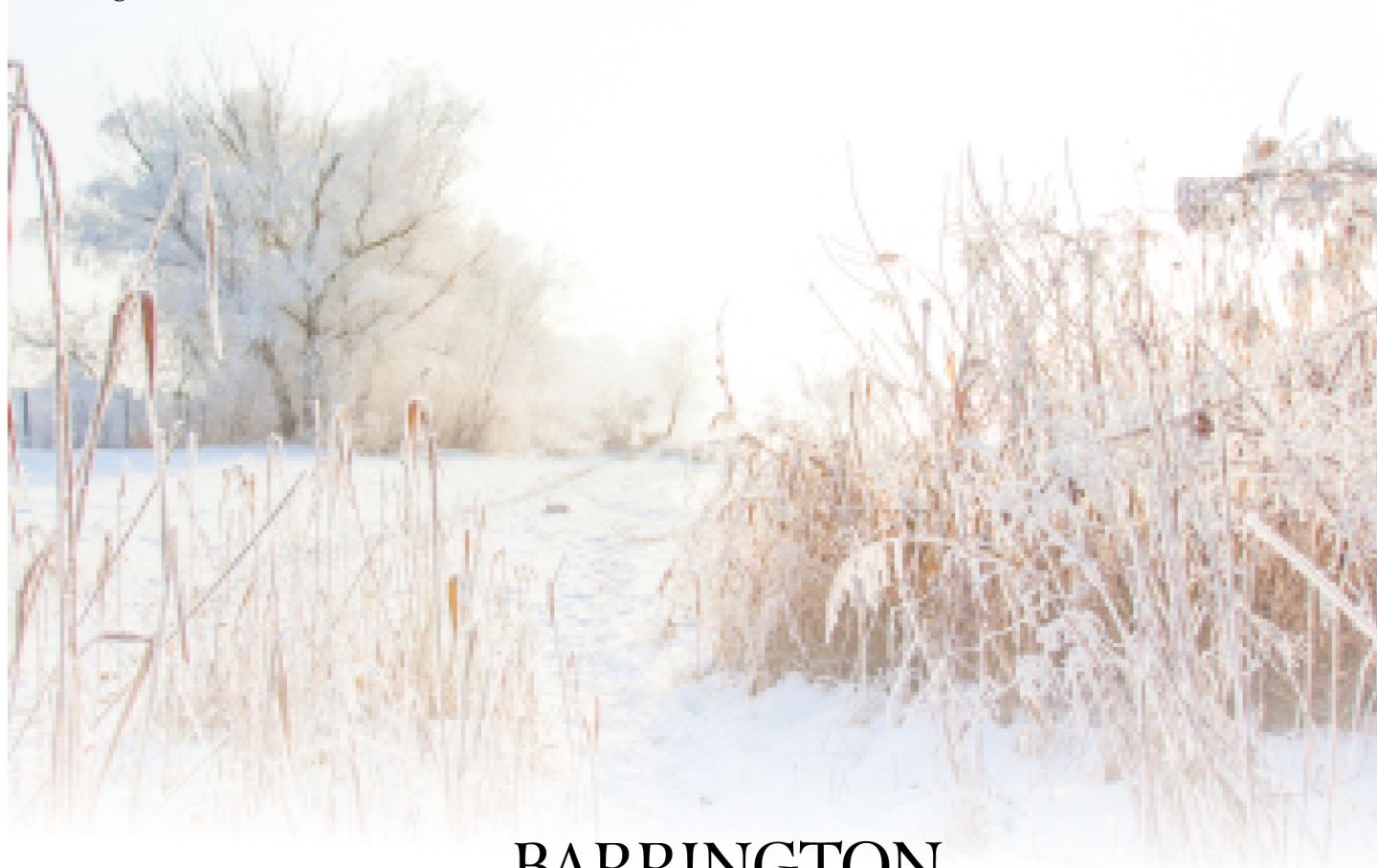


A Wesleyan Journey of Prayer
