CONNECT – Getting to know one another

Question 1: How can a righteous God give grace to people we think are truly evil?

Question 2: Describe a time you obeyed God with a bad attitude.

Question 12: Did God speak sternly or compassionately to Jonah? Why do you think he


did so?

Question 13: How is mankind's understanding of justice and mercy different from God's?

(Exodus 33:19)

Question 14: Jonah sat down in the blistering desert sun to see what God would do to

Nineveh. How did God show compassion to this angry man?



- Question 15: Facing another day in the scorching sun, Jonah's vine died. What did the vine reveal about Jonah's attitude?
- Question 16: What was God's final question to Jonah?
- Question 17: Considering Jonah as a person, how would you describe his most significant weaknesses? Are you vulnerable to being a Jonah?
- Question 18: What is your reaction to the book of Jonah? What is the truth that God was trying to get Jonah to understand, and why is it so important for us right now?

DISCIPLESHIP - Becoming and doing

- Question 19: Why is it dangerous for us to define any group of people as "the enemy"? (Eph 6:12)
- Question 20: Are we sometimes wishing that God's judgment would fall on certain "other" people? In what ways is that damaging to the church and to the ministry of the gospel?
- Question 21: Have you ever been angry with God? How did you work that out with him, or do you need to talk to him further about it?
- Question 22: What are some ways you can show compassion to marginalized people?
- Question 23: How can you strengthen your spiritual foundation so you will have courage to obey when called by God?
