I.	TRUE HEALING: Found in the "Author of Life". (Acts 3:11-16)
	Peter heals a man, not by his own power, but through in Jesus.
	Greek word: archēgon tēs zōes = "AUTHOR of Life" (v. 15)
	Healing isn't the end goal; it points to Jesus as the true source ofLIFE

II. TRUE REPENTANCE: A call to turn toward God and realign our lives to the Holy Spirit. (Acts 3:17-19a)

Peter doesn't sugarcoat the truth; the people **REJECTED**Jesus.

	Repentance isn't just feeling bad; it's realigning with God and authentically turning in a new
III.	TRUE RENEWAL: The ongoing work of God's grace, bringing refreshment to weary souls. (Acts 3:19b & 25-26)
	Peter promises "times of refreshing" (anapsyxis) meaning ongoing and revival in Jesus.
	Greek word: $euloge\bar{o}$ = "to $_$ BLESS $_$, cause to flourish" (v. 25)
	The grace we receive is meant to beSHARED with the city around us.
