NORTHSHORE'S COMPELLING STATEMENT

Hope changes everything.

ICE BREAKER

BACKGROUND

In the previous chapter, Paul made his defense before King Agrippa in Caesarea. They concluded that he had done nothing “deserving death or imprisonment” (Acts 26:31) and that he could have been set free “if he had not appealed to Caesar” (v32). It was at this point that he was put on a ship sailing to Italy so that he could make his way to Rome, to stand trial before the emperor. Since the charges against him were unresolved, Paul was still traveling as a prisoner, likely chained to a Roman guard. Throughout this chapter, the word “we” is often used, indicating that Luke the physician was not merely writing about Paul’s journey, but that he was with him through this seafaring journey.

They left from Sidon, which is on the east coast of the Mediterranean Sea, and sailed north towards the Island of Cyprus, staying relatively near the coast where they were protected from the wind by the island. They eventually made it to the island of Crete, which is in the center of the Mediterranean. At this point, the fast of the Day of Atonement had passed, meaning that it was early October. This was a dangerous season to be sailing. Paul had already been shipwrecked three times, so he knew the dangers they could face at this time of year. This is why he warns the centurion not to leave Crete. Though he favored Paul and gave him many privileges, he yielded to the advice of the pilot and owner of the ship (v11), so they ventured on to their perilous journey.

In the midst of the storm when all had lost hope, God provided Paul with a promise. None of these men would perish (v24). Paul later reminds them of this and encourages them to eat to restore their strength. And after they saw Paul break bread with thanksgiving, they too were encouraged and restored their strength. God used Paul, one among 275, to encourage all of them because he had the faith to believe God’s word that was spoken to him. And just as promised, all men were spared.

REVIEW

2. Why did Paul advise against sailing any further at Crete? How did he know it was going to be dangerous? (v9-10)
3. When did they lose hope of being saved? (v20)
4. How did Paul encourage them? (vv33-36)

DEEPER DISCOVERY:

What does the Bible tell us about what our attitude should be during adversity?

Read the following verses:

- James 1:2-4
- Romans 5:3-5
- Romans 12:12
- 1 Peter 4:12-13



HEART LEVEL: *What does it mean? These questions help us shape our beliefs around the objective truth of God's word.*

1. In what ways does Paul's journey show how God's plans are carried out regardless of circumstances or human decisions?
2. Why did God allow this harsh storm even though Paul was going where God wanted him to?
3. How did Paul find strength in a dark and hopeless time?



HANDS LEVEL: *What does it mean to me? These questions help us commit to live out the truth in our everyday lives and commit to potential next steps.*

1. What character qualities does Paul show through this journey that you would like to imitate?
2. Paul believed God's Word would happen exactly as it had been told. How can we build up each other's faith so that we believe God's Word like this?
3. Paul was able to encourage a whole ship of hopeless sailors by sharing God's Word with them. Is there someone you know who is going through a rough storm? How can you encourage and provide hope to them?
