- **<u>Disparity</u>** in wealth or material possessions among believers in Christ is **evil**.

Acts 4:32-37 IS saying...

• When the <u>Holy Spirit is at work in us</u>, we will <u>take care of one</u> <u>another</u> when they are in need.
