Do you have a passion for working with youth and helping them grow in their relationship with Jesus? If so, you might be the perfect fit to be our Youth Intern at South Delta Baptist Church for the summer of 2026.

SDBC is a missional Christian church in Delta, BC—a suburb of Vancouver. We are committed to worshipping God, participating in God’s mission to preach the gospel, and sharing the love of Jesus with our community by embodying the gospel through radical (biblical) hospitality. In obedience to the bible, we are committed to following Jesus and serving our city, nation, and world by living in authentic community as missionaries of Jesus Christ wherever we are. PRIMARY OBJECTIVES

1. To assist the Youth & Young Adults Pastor with planning, preparing, promoting, and executing our summer youth events which exist to help students see Jesus more clearly and cultivate a whole-life relationship with him. For each event, the intern will be responsible for recruiting and organizing volunteers, acquiring materials, preparing and leading activities, designing graphics, and promoting events via social media and other platforms.
2. To spearhead special summer projects to help bolster youth ministry in the 2026/27 school year. This will ideally include designing a social media strategy, developing games, upgrading our youth ministry spaces, and improving our registration, integration, and follow-up system.
3. To foster ongoing relationships with our youth, preteens, and leaders throughout the summer. The intern will take initiative in reaching out to students and leaders, which includes connecting with those present at Sunday church gatherings and organizing informal hangouts outside of programmed events such as coffee meetings or game nights.

- Love for the bible and passion to see others love the bible

- Ability to creatively plan and execute dynamic ministry programs, events, initiatives, trips, etc.
- Ability to engage the unchurched and churched through the various elements of our program
- Ability to work collaboratively and independently (which includes being proactive in anticipating and meeting needs without external direction)
- Willingness to step outside one's comfort zone to be outgoing and meet new people
- Dependable, flexible, and servant-hearted, willing to do any job with joy and passion

RESPONSIBILITIES

Summer Youth Events

- Assist in planning, organizing, and sourcing materials for weekly summer youth events
- Lead, recruit, and coordinate volunteers for *Friday Fanfares*—a hospitality ministry for returning Qwanoes campers—and take charge of following up with families with the goal of connecting local students to our youth group (must be available Friday evenings)
- Create graphics and promote events via social media and word of mouth

Summer Projects

- Assist in planning for the new youth ministry school year, which includes developing a calendar of games, content, questions, activities, and special events
- Improve the aesthetic and functionality of facilities used for youth ministry events

- Rework our social media platforms and strategies to maximize reach and engagement
- Developing a seamless registration, integration, and follow-up system designed to establish meaningful connections with youth and their families and sustain their engagement with Jesus and his church

General

- Foster meaningful connections with youth and young adults who are present for Sunday morning worship gatherings by greeting them by name and having conversations with them
- Cleaning and maintaining youth ministry spaces and equipment
- Help foster a ministry culture of presence to God and each other
- Take ownership of inviting new people to serve on a regular basis

- Regular work week: Monday-Friday.
- 35 hours per week for 8 consecutive weeks.
- Anticipated start date: July 6th.
