to us and to all men.

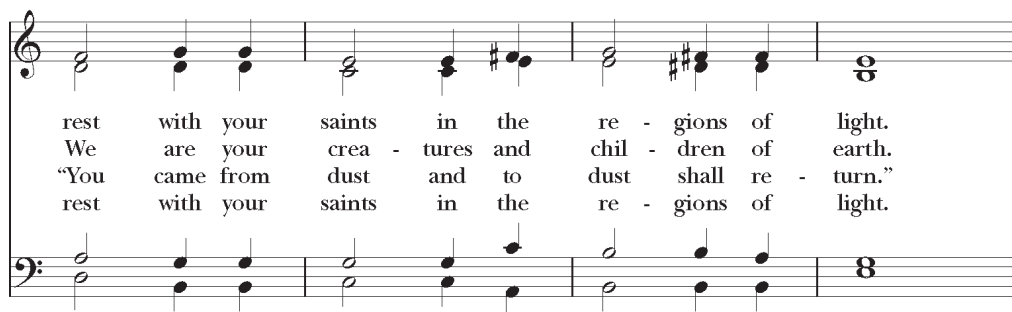
We bless thee for our creation, preservation,

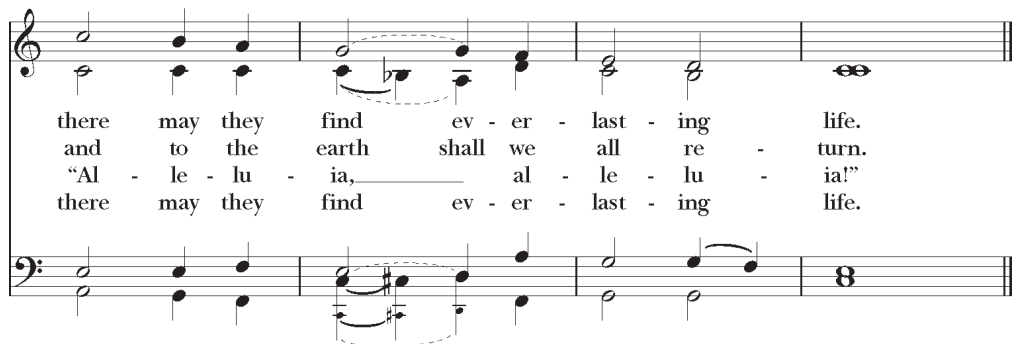
