

PASTOR'S PEACE by Sarah Teti for the Food Pantry Expansion Task Force

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THE NEED. When most of the world was shutting down, the Food Pantry of First Presbyterian stayed open during the pandemic experiencing dramatic growth. It wasn't easy but the community, the volunteers, and the church rallied to meet the need. As the dust begins to settle and life returns to normal, two things are clear. Food insecurity persists and will most likely grow; First Presbyterian and the Food Pantry will continue to not only meet the need of the hungry, but grow in new ways to meet more needs.

A HISTORY OF GROWTH. What began in a closet with bunch of cans, a few boxes and the desire of two members, Ed and Jane, has grown into a "client choice" program serving more than 6,000 people annually. Along the way the food pantry has taken up more and more space. Yet, we've reached a limit. In order to meet and to continue the growth we need more dedicated space to achieve programmatic flexibility as well as expanded services. We need a larger space to meet the growth in need and service. Right now, to meet the need and keep our commitment to "client choice" we need about 1,000 square feet.

THE GOOD NEWS. We have a place to grow. The current home of the Food Pantry, the Social Center of First Presbyterian, can expand to meet our growing needs. And we have 80% of the funds to meet the cost of the expansion. Through the generosity of our community and a county grant, we already have \$410,000 to meet the estimated cost of expansion (\$500,000).

OUR DREAM OF PARTNERSHIP. The Food Pantry of First Presbyterian wants to build an expansion solely by the generosity and leadership of the community and county. We see this as a partnership. What is given by the community goes to feed the community. Our congregation is the place for the community's generosity to meet the need of the hungry. Let's build the future of the FPC Food Pantry together.



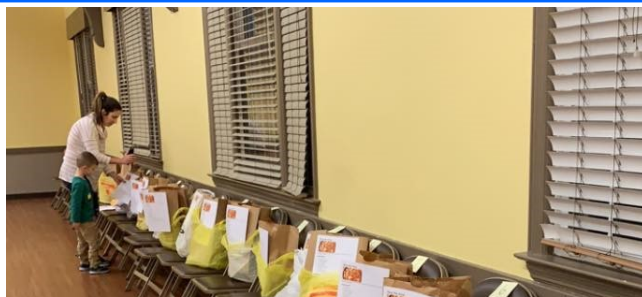
LOCAL MISSION REPORTS:

In January, we kicked off the year with a Mission Volunteer Night that was sponsored by a local family, the Bhasin Family, and their business, 1West. They paid for all of the supplies needed to make 100 Hygiene Kits for our local homeless outreach social workers!

February's Mission Volunteer Night was all about packaging "Busy Day" Soup Kits for 50 of our families and completely sponsored by the "Mommas Of Metuchen" Group. They raised over \$1,200! We are so grateful for such giving spirits!

STEWARDSHIP 2023

Our church is coming off a couple of difficult years that were brought about by the devastation of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Finance Commission of the Session understood this and tried to adjust the budget accordingly. Please remember that the pledge amount is only one source of income used to fund our church, there are other sources like cash in the collection plate, parking and building use; all of which are below pre-pandemic levels.

For 2023, pledges were budgeted at \$450,000 based on past performance. Unfortunately, we came in considerably short in dollars pledged and number of members who pledged.

As a result, we need to focus on a:

PATH TO RECOVERY

After 43% of the 379 giving units have pledged, these are the current results of the stewardship campaign.

2023 Artist in Residence Program

We are pleased to announce a new initiative in our Church to incorporate art as an avenue for spiritual and personal growth. We have commissioned a local artist to create an art piece related to the theme of "Forgiveness" which gives us the opportunity to explore both the theme and art as part of our congregational focus.

The goals of the program beyond commissioning of a piece of art are several fold:

- As a congregation we will explore ART as a new form of ministry, therapy and spiritual growth. Just like singing, puppetry and poetry, art can be a very engaging experience.
- Use the Artist in Residence Program to engage the local community as well as members of the congregation. The program will culminate in a Fall Art Exhibition in our Social Center where we will unveil our work of art and invite other artists to show their works related to forgiveness and spiritual growth.
- The artist will be setting up a working studio in Room 204 and this will give us opportunities for small group sessions where we can talk with him about the creative process and how that process can aid in spiritual growth. There will be three second-hour forums led by the Artist explaining his approach to the theme of Forgiveness and how he approaches his art.
- Finally as a congregation, we will explore ways to

discuss the concept of Forgiveness in Bible studies and Second Hour forums. We will also look for ways to add art into our committee-led activities.

The Artist in Residence is a program brought forward by Rev. Ashley Bair, approved by Personnel and functions under the guidance of Worship and Music led by Virginia Shaw. The committee members are: Moggie Davis, Mary Kay Dangremond, Robin Kellner, Lorraine LeSter, Kat Davis and Amy Bellisano. We will serve as the liaison and support for the artist during the contract period of March 1 through October 31.

Joseph Castronova is our 2023 Artist in Residence. He is an artist and educator and lives right here in Metuchen with his family. Please see his amazing profile below.

We chose to work with Joe for a variety of reasons: his ties to the local community and arts community, his interest in the theme that was selected and his desire to be present with us as we create this new ministry, explore the theme, and maximize our exposure within the Metuchen community. Joe's artistic process is central to the exploration of how to use art as therapy and art as an expression of spirituality.

Joseph has shown extensively in our area including: Transformations Gallery, Rotunda Gallery, Barron Arts

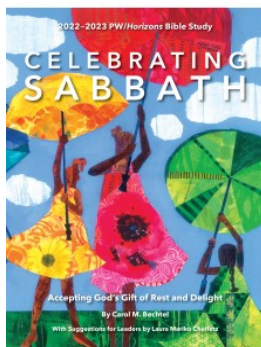

MUSIC Mini try

Postludes in the Season of Lent

The way preludes and postludes are treated differs greatly from congregation to congregation. For some, the prelude is pre-worship background music and the postlude is merely exit music. While we have no official “stance,” it appears that FPC takes another approach.

Here, many folks view the prelude as a time to quiet their hearts for worship, a time for gathering ourselves as individuals and as a corporate body. The postlude sends us into our week, serving as a “musical charge” to follow the charge and benediction from the pastors. Of course, just like all music during worship, the prelude and postlude are primarily a musical offering to God.

During the season of Lent, the use of the organ varies widely, as well. The Roman Catholic Church instructs that “the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only in order to support the singing.” That would mean no prelude, postlude, or any other solo organ music—the organ is used only for hymn-singing. Some churches go as far as strictly singing unaccompanied, or “acapella,” during Lent. On the opposite end of the spectrum, other churches have year-round boisterous postludes, breaking only for services such as Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Due to the pensive and penitential nature of the Lenten season, we will not hear any postludes until Palm Sunday, at which time, the postlude will characterize the day’s duality of somber celebration. Our Maundy Thursday worship will be the peak of Lenten solemnity; there will be no postlude, and the congregation will be encouraged to depart in silence.

Organ postludes lead us to reflect on the worship service and propel you into the week ahead. I would encourage all to consider that the absence of a postlude may—although to a different effect—serve the same purpose. Silence, too, can make a powerful statement.

The Lenten Concert Series has become a highlight of our Lenten season here at our church. When you can carve out just half an hour out of a busy day, this is an opportunity to sit and enjoy some music that is sure to refresh your spirit.

We are thrilled to present the lineup of musicians who will grace the Wednesday Noon concert series. They are accomplished musicians who will bring beautiful performances for everyone’s delight.

And those who cannot make it in person will have a chance to enjoy the concert as we will livestream the entire half hour from our website and Facebook. Spread the word around!

This year’s Lenten Concert is dedicated to the victims and the recovery taking place in Turkey and Syria. We will be taking free will offering towards this and welcome your participation. We hope you can partner with us in this mission.

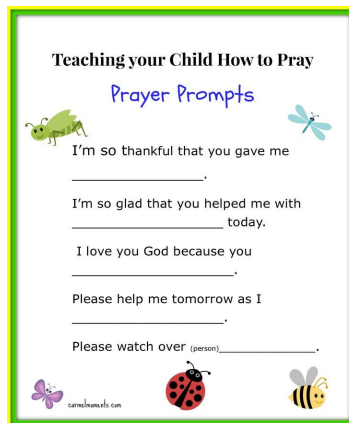

February was a busy month for FPC Youth!

At the very end of January the Youth hosted a **Pancake Breakfast Fundraiser** after worship. Youth and members of the Youth Mission Trip committee whipped up a tremendous amount of pancakes and sausage which allowed them to raise over \$1,000 in donations going toward the Habitat for Humanity trip this summer. It was so wonderful to see so many people gather once again in the Social Center for a pancake breakfast.

Later that week the Youth Group enjoyed a few rounds of **mini golf together at Monster Golf.**

On Saturday, February 5th, the Youth participated in a **Youth Day of Service** that went from 9 am until 1 pm. The youth assembled 285 bag lunches for Elijah's Promise. A total of 1,013 pounds of food was collected during the one hour Flash Food Drive, where donors drove their cars up to the door with their food donations and were giving a chance to win a gift card to Pastry Lu if they guessed the total weight of food collected at the end of the hour.

The youth enjoyed learning from two guest speakers. Julian DuTemple, a High School senior from St. Joe's, shared details on how he started a successful neighborhood food drive. Olivia Forte-Gardner from REPLENISH explained what REPLENISH and Feeding Middlesex County does to help end hunger in our county. She discussed the difference between a food pantry and a food bank and how they are connected. She also shared ideas on running food drives, and many other enlightening information on food insecurity.

After the restocking the Food Pantry shelves with all the donations, they took part in a brainstorming session and came up with new ideas for Food Drives. The day ended with a closing ceremony where the youth and adult volunteers washed each other's hands and then shared a meal together.

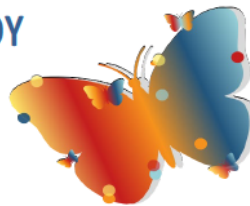
