As Christians, our faith teaches us everyone is created in God's image and commands us to love one another. As Americans, we value our system of government and the good that can be accomplished in our constitutional democracy. "Christian nationalism" is a term you may have encountered in the press, on social media platforms and in casual conversations in your workplace, neighborhood, or church. It is a framework of thinking that threatens our faith and our pluralistic democracy. What is Christian Nationalism in America, and how should Christians respond to it?

In this class, we will learn what Christian Nationalism is, why it is a threat, and how we can respond. We will learn why some people are susceptible to this ideology, how to talk with them, and how to express our views in a respectful and clear manner. This is a class for all levels – those who are just learning of the term, Christian Nationalism, as well as those who are more well-versed. We will follow a three-part curriculum from Christians Against Christian Nationalism, which includes videos and documentaries. We will establish norms for the class at the outset, so that our dialogue, while frank, is also respectful and considerate.



BIRDING & SPIRITUALITY

Does being in nature bring you joy? Are you noticing birds in your backyard and want to learn more about them? Birding is one of the most popular pastimes in North America and is an edifying way to learn about nature, relieve stress, and cultivate a spiritual practice. In this session, we will be led by Nicole Netherton, CEO of Pease Park Conservancy, Travis Audubon Member, enthusiastic backyard birder, and Saint John's member. We will focus on both practical aspects of birding in Central Texas and will help you learn to look and listen for birds with mindfulness. Geared toward beginners, but all are welcome.

The learning session will be on Zoom the evening of Tuesday, October 15th (6:30-8:00pm), followed by a birdwalk on the morning of Saturday, October 19th (7:30-9:30am) at Sheffield Park (Northwest Park). At Sheffield Park, terrain is mostly flat and on sidewalks, but some uneven surfaces possible. Loaner binoculars will be available.

The Holy Spirit gives every Christian at least one spiritual gift. In this class we will seek to identify the gift(s) God has given us and discuss what that means and how we might use our Gifts. Paul lists some of the gifts in Romans 12, Ephesians 4, and I Corinthians 12, such as, generosity, healing, discernment, compassion, etc. Spiritual gifts are not given for our own benefit but for the common good to strengthen the unity of the church. When we serve from our spiritual gifts, we grow in our knowledge of God's love, expand our understanding of discipleship, and find greater joy in serving God and others.

ENNEAGRAM WORKSHOP

Have you heard people talk about the Enneagram or "their number" and wondered about it, or wanted to take a class but didn't have time? Did you learn something about it a while ago and want to dig a little deeper? Are you interested in a spiritual tool that helps you understand what drives you to do some things you had rather not, or that offers clarity about the motivations of other people? This one day class, led by Rev. Georjean Blanton, our resident Enneagram coach, offers a basic primer to help the beginner (or those seeking a review) understand the Enneagram and identify their number, as well as an enhanced examination of triads and stances for those who want a deeper study. This class offers some tools for moving toward that balance. Cost is \$40 and includes lunch.



This September, overlapping with Hispanic Heritage Month, JFON Austin will be offering a 6-week study online called "Centering Immigrant Voices for Faithful Growth," a new online study of The Truth in Our Stories, the book and video project JFON collaborated with Undocumented Stories to produce in 2022.

For this study, Executive Director Lizzie Wright will draw on her role as a pastor in the United Methodist Church to lead questions and discussion of the stories, data, and scripture in a Christian context.
