

We hope that is what you experience as you review these pages.



# SPIRITUAL FORMATION

Spiritual formation—the shaping of a

person's inner life after the pattern of Christ—is happening at Cornerstone in both large and small groups. In 2022, we had roughly 60 people involved in either Core Classes or discipleship groups, or both. This is the largest participation in intentional pathways to growth in the history of the church.

Our three, 6-week Core Classes introduce biblical story, doctrine, and spirituality, all of which are shaping emphases in the life and teaching of the church. Cornerstone's distinctive approach to the Bible is learned in these classes. That emphasis is then honed into core convictions for ministry in our 10-week summer Core Leadership course.

Our purpose here at Cornerstone is to follow Jesus Christ in His mission to make all things new. (Revelation 21:5) In the Children's Ministry, we join in that mission by sharing our love for God's Word with the kids. On Sunday mornings, the kids will read the Bible, pray, sing, do crafts, and play. Our teachers use these activities as opportunities to point them to Jesus and show that He is at the center of God's story of salvation. Our hope is to help you create opportunities at home for truth-filled, spiritual conversations through the material we send home (such as catechism review and memory verses). Every summer, we hold a week-long VBS (Vacation Bible School) for the kids where they learn about a specific concept about God through song, dance, and Scripture.

God is working to raise up the next generation, and we are blessed to be a part of God's mission.

In the nursery (ages 0-3), we are committed to offering a safe place where our youngest children will be introduced to the gospel. Our hope is to lay a solid foundation for them of who Jesus is and what He has to offer them. In the nurturing and stimulating environment we have cultivated, each child is known, valued, and loved. Scripture instructs us to "train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it" (Prov. 22:6) and we believe it is never too early to start!

Middle and high school are vital times in life where students are searching for their identity and longing to discern what they really believe. Our vision at Cornerstone is to create a space for our youth that feels like their own where they can come and learn the truths of Scripture in a safe (and fun!) environment.

We live out this vision through Wednesday night Youth Group, Sunday school, our monthly events, and winter and summer camps. During Wednesday night Youth Group, we play fun games and spend time connecting with each other. This is followed by singing worship songs together, listening to a message, and discussing that message in small groups. At Sunday school, we dive deeper into Scripture and theology so that we can help our students better understand the Word of God and grasp its rich beauty. Throughout the year, we hold events for our youth—- everything from going to a trampoline park to getting messy with food wars. We also take our students to winter and summer camps so that they can get connected with each other on a deeper level by eating meals together, laughing with one another, and praying for each other. In this season of our students' lives, we want to make sure we give them the tools they need to learn theology, but also have plenty of space to be themselves in a loving, gospel-centered community.

It has been a blessing to work with the youth the past two years. Getting to watch them grow in their faith, their knowledge of the Bible, and their love for Christ has been a beautiful journey. I want to thank you all for giving me the opportunity to walk alongside our students. It has been a privilege to get to know them, hang out with them, and to study the Word of God together.

I started volunteering with the youth on Wednesday nights in August 2021 and became a staff member in January 2022 where I got more involved by attending winter and summer camps, leading summer bible studies, and occasionally teaching Sunday school. I also get together weekly with the middle and high school girls to just hang out and get to know them whether getting coffee, having picnics, going to the mall, etc.


It's been incredible over the past year to see our youth really feel at home at youth group and to see them excited to invite their friends into that "home". Over the past year, they seem more open to asking questions and willing to wrestle through things that they might not understand or find difficult to reconcile with. Summer camp was especially pivotal to our kids' relationships with one another. Certain barriers that they may

have felt or experienced (whether because they attend different schools or otherwise) were able to be overcome by the shared experiences of being in cabins together, studying the Word together, and just living life alongside one another for a week.

It has been so encouraging to work with our youth this past year and a half. Teenagers are so often underestimated in terms of what they are thinking about, so to get to experience their insights about the Lord and witness the waves that they are making at school, in the church, or even at home for Christ is remarkable. I am grateful for the many ways the students have encouraged and challenged me in my own faith and thinking.

### MISSION TO THE RUSSIAN SPEAKING WORLD

MTRW (Mission to the Russian Speaking World) provides theological education for potential church planters and ministers among Russian-speaking people. Cornerstone currently covers the cost of an entire year of theological education for one student from Belarus at the ERSU (Evangelical Reformed Seminary of Ukraine).

### COVENANT OF GRACE

Covenant of Grace, the first Russian Presbyterian Church in America, located in North Port, uniquely positioned to bring the gospel to immigrants from Eastern Europe. Pastor Aleksey preached here at Cornerstone last year.

### NEWTOWN CONNECTION

The overall vision of Newtown Connection, in tandem with Boys & Girls Clubs of Sarasota, is to introduce a new and diverse group of youth to an after-school program centered on Sports, Health and Education. The major focuses of the program include sports, health and education, trauma recovery, and positive character trait development.

### **SEMINARY STUDENTS**

Cornerstone is committed to equipping the local church with seminary trained men and women. It is a joy to support our very own Taylor White (Covenant Theological Seminary) and Rebecca Woods (Reformed Theological Seminary) as they pursue theological training while serving here at Cornerstone.

### REFORMED UNIVERSITY FELLOWSHIP

Reformed University Fellowship (RUF) is a campus ministry that reaches college students from all backgrounds with the hope of Jesus Christ. College is a time when beliefs are explored, decisions are made, and lives are changed. We invite students into authentic relationships and the study of God's Word. Through the ministry of RUF, students discover the love of Christ, find their significance in God's redemptive story, and engage in the life of His church.

Cornerstone currently support ministries at Florida Gulf Coast University, University of South Florida and Samford University.



### THE CALL TO ASSOCIATE PASTOR




BILL MARTIN, RULING ELDER, DIRECTOR OF SPIRITUAL FORMATION
