

Rather, an adopted Resolution is recommended to be studied, prayed over, and discussed within congregations. The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is unique among denominations in that authority resides primarily with the congregation. The General Church cannot impose its will, or even the Resolutions, upon Regions or Congregations. This style of governance emerges from a core Disciples identity of every individual's right of access to the Gospel. It is our fundamental desire to be a biblical people and an interpretive people. The membership of local congregations is expected to read and interpret scripture for the living of these days, engaging with the moral, ethical and religious matters that confront church and world.

Some Resolutions may be perceived as controversial. When engaging in controversial topics, and in a Church of such grand and glorious diversity, it is essential to recall our denominational values so that our passions do not overwhelm our compassion and unity. Those values are:

 Jesus is the Christ, son of the Living God, and our Savior

- The call to ministry that is on every Disciple
- The love of unity
- The practice of the justice of God
