Pastor's Message from Co-Senior Minister, Matthew Harris-Gloyer

The child is refusing to get out of the car. Crammed into the furthest back seat with a mischievous grin, the child states firmly that they are not going to school. The parent feels the frustration mount, threatening to boil over. By



God's grace, a video they'd watched just the other day pops into their prefrontal cortex: "pause power" is not just for kids, it's for grownups too. Taking a deep breath, the parent shows the child that everything is going to be okay. It takes a bit more gentle conversation and the child exits the car and goes in to school.

Millions of families have similar stories as school starts up. For all of you (parents, grandparents, teachers, aides, coaches), I offer my encouragement to keep exercising your "pause power."

I've been reflecting upon the stress and strain that many church members have been confessing to me over the last few months. Some say they feel alone in their worries, while others openly wonder where, and how, they may activate their faith in response to their deeply held moral values. I find that most often my ministry is to invite people to try out their "pause power," albeit not an answer to their questions nor a solution to loneliness. Rev. Vicki Kemper, United Church of Christ pastor in Amherst, MA, wrote a short devotional that spoke God's truth into my life, and I invite you to read it here.

Rev. Kemper quotes Matthew 6:25: [Jesus said,] "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear." Rev. Kemper continues, "Telling someone not to worry is about as effective as telling them to calm down, which is to say: not at all... But in telling us not to worry, Jesus doesn't say there's nothing to worry about. Instead, he acknowledges that things are a hot mess; it's all we can do to take one day's troubles at a time."

Jesus invites us to slow down, observe the birds and look at the lilies. I read this as spiritual pause power. By noticing God's majesty in creation, we may then find our emotional and spiritual grounding. Then, we may choose with all our full capacities where we will direct our love, time and attention.



Green Chalice Team - A Creation Care Ministry

We covenant to: Worship God with all creation and pray for the healing of the earth; rest in God's good creation and invite others to delight in nature. *Psalm 19:1: The heavens declare God's glory, and the sky proclaims His handiwork.*

On August 24 many congregants learned about the Co-pastors' recent trip to the Disciples General Assembly in Memphis, Tennessee. They shared highlights of their experience, and also brought to our attention a number of 2025 Resolutions, many concerned with human rights and justice. One major goal of the Green Chalice Certification deals with community outreach, justice, and advocacy for creation care policies at local, state or federal levels. Many of the Resolutions we examined on August 24 dealt with real issues that are of concern in the community. Joining with other faiths and organizations makes a stronger impact upon those making important decisions about the future.

One way to make an impact upon all issues threatening God's creation is EDUCATION.

Here are training sessions to consider to make a positive difference in our future:

Ecumenical Climate Ambassador Training

September is the Season of Creation and Disciples are partnering with Blessed Tomorrow and eight other denominations to offer this free climate training LIVE online. Join us for a **Christian Climate Training on September 27, 2025 from 8:30 - 11:30** am. You may also take the training on your own schedule alone or with a group. Register here.

Saturday, November 16, 8:30 am - 12:30 pm Green Chalice has 100+ Trained Climate Ambassadors leading in their churches and communities. (Learn more here.)

Salem FCC is approved as a Certified Green Chalice Ministry! The Green Chalice Team applied for this certification, outlining all of the goals achieved in five different categories of "practices" in our church related to creation care: 1) Building/Office Practices; 2) Ground/Property/Restoration/Conservation;

3) Worship and Education; 4) Community
Outreach/Justice/Advocacy; 5) Resilience-Disaster
Preparedness/Climate Anxiety/Grief Care.

What you should know as members of this

congregation is that many of the points counted toward this certification were credits given for the decisions that have been made for many years that reflect concerns for safety, conservation, community outreach, worship and education. So congratulations goes to you who served in leadership positions for these many years! Thank you!

Nduta Nyoro-Cayton is collecting donations for school children to send to an operational centre located at Emanyonyi in Bunyore, Western Kenya.


Collecting for male and female students, ages 6-16. Items may be used, in good condition, or new:

A book for our times by Ruth Fletcher has recently come to my attention: "THRIVE, Spiritual Habits of Transforming Congregations," a book to help us navigate the changing times.

At SFCC we have done studies on practicing Spiritual habits as an individual but Fletcher shows that practicing Spiritual habits as a church might show us new ways of seeing the world around us. One sentence in the introduction caught my attention and seems to be the thrust of this book:

"Transforming congregations allow themselves to be changed by the power of the Spirit into

new creations capable of telling an old story in a way that is relevant to a new time."

The author, Ruth Fletcher, is a minister in the Christian Church (DOC) and a regional minister of the Christian Church in Montana. She bases this book on her personal experience and research of Protestant churches across the country. She uses stories from churches as well as stories of Jesus' ministry to illustrate the Spiritual habits of transforming congregations.
