Pastor's Message from Co-Senior Minister, Matthew Harris-Gloyer

Some people are surprised to find out that we went the entire term of pregnancy not knowing the sex of our child. We wanted to be surprised. Even though we did all the modern day doctors' visits and classes, we wanted this one commonality with ancestors from before the time of ultrasound technology. For nine months we called our growing child, "Baby." Every night we sang lullabies to "Baby." We noticed "Baby's" movements in the morning, and her/his responses to various foods. When "Baby" was born, I yelped for joy. At some point before birth day, we chose the name, Kaiden, because it could be a girl's or boy's name. It means "beloved companion," and our "Baby" was, and is, just that.

reinforce that Kaiden belongs in our family. The research also shows that this work of belonging cannot be done solely within family units. It reminds me of the traditional saying, "It takes a village to raise a child." There's another that is similar: "It takes a church to raise a parent."

Church is the place where I have found my deepest belonging; a place where people noticed that I was there (and noticed when I wasn't), where people called me by my name, and where people knew me: my successes and failures, joys and remorses. This desire to provide such a place of belonging for everyone (as it was provided for me) is a big part of what drives my calling to ministry. And what I love about Disciples of Christ is that this work isn't mine alone. Rather, in our DOC tradition, ministry

Named, Noticed, Known: A Framework for Belonging

Sunday, October 12, 2025 | 12:30-2:30 pm

St. Paul's Episcopal Church (across from Bush Park)
How do we cultivate spaces where our teenagers
can experience belonging? Based on national
research on teens and mental health, this workshop
will present a simple framework that can inform
how adults can accompany young people, in our
ministries, in the community, and in our lives. This
workshop is hosted by Rev. Chris Dela Cruz, with
Youth Solidarity Movement (YSM), an initiative
of Together Lab, and a partner with Salem Youth
Collective. YSM cultivates community for teenagers
and the adults who support them so that young
people can experience belonging in Oregon.
