




Salem Youth Collective - EZ Orchards

The Green Chalice Team thanks you for participating in this project: caring for God's earth, and interacting with other earth care teams in the community to unite and become more impactful in our efforts!





The book is called "Unoffendable" written by Brant Hansen. A major theme the author addresses is "Letting go of our 'right' to be offended and how that could be the most



simplifying, refreshing, stress-relieving, life-giving thing we can do."

The author touches on many ways we can be offended, giving personal examples. Brant uses scripture to show how Jesus, who could have so easily been offended in so many ways, showed love and forgiveness instead. Quite frankly there were parts of this book which offended me, but the more I read, the more it touched my heart and my mind. This is a book you can open to any page and say, "Wow, I never thought of justice, understanding others, trusting God to be God, etc., like that!"
