Pastor's Message from Co-Senior Minister, Michelle Harris-Gloyer


Happy New Year, God's Beloved!

The new year always comes around, ready or not. But for Christians, we get multiple new year's celebrations. The beginning of the Christian liturgical year begins with Advent!

Advent is a season observed in most Christian denominations,

beginning four Sundays before Christmas. It is a time of waiting and preparing to mark Jesus' birth at Christmas. It is a time during which we enter into the mystery of God being enfleshed in the world through the Christ child— and a time to wonder about how God is still entering and moving through the world.

Our SFCC theme this Advent is "Abide with Us." It's the title of both our worship series and our Advent devotional provided by our Teaching Ministry Team. "Abide" may seem like a word from another era. You might only hear it if you are in church, reading



or talking about the Bible, or watching the movie "The Big Lebowski" (which I've actually never seen but still know the movie quote: "The dude abides!"). "Abide" is a verb that means "to accept or act in accordance with" (dictionary.com).

In a world so quick to get distracted, disconnected, pulled away, and segregated—from one another and from God—maybe we can use some abiding now more than ever.

In this Advent plea of "Abide with Us," it is a prayer and a kind of new year's re-start, reset, revival

plea. It is a readiness to receive Christ's presence. More than to agree with or accept us, it is a prayer for Christ to dwell both within us and among us. In the fourth verse of "O Little Town of Bethlehem" we sing, "O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel!" As you breathe deep Holy Spirit breaths, may it be so for you this Advent.

At the Board meeting November 30, your representatives faithfully served you and our church. We are in solid financial shape for the upcoming year, with the Giving and Sharing team still seeking giving estimate information. We accepted the 2026 Revised Budget. Our banking will change from U.S. Bank to Willamette Valley Bank, with 3% interest offered on all accounts.

Those church members attending on November 23 approved the list of nominees for 2026 leadership positions at our Annual Church Meeting. The Board approved the list of 2026 Deacons.

We approved a Quasi-Endowment fund of \$1.4 million dollars through the Christian Church Foundation. The monies in this fund will continue to grow annually, but are available for major emergencies; retrieval rate was established at 3.5%.

The Board thanks you for your continued trust and faith.


Thank You
