Pastor's Message from Co-Senior Minister, Michelle Harris-Gloyer

New Year's Blessing to You, God's Beloved!

January 6th is Epiphany—the 12th day of Christmas and the end of the Season of Christmas. I always embrace the 12 days of Christmas because there is simply too much mystery and too many hopes to fit into one Christmas Day. And likewise—there are too many questions and dreams to fit into one New Year's Day reset.

On Epiphany Sunday in worship, we marked the Magi's visit to encounter Jesus. We remember these wise ones following a bright star as the way God guided them. Those physically present in worship on January 4th were invited to choose a small (face-down, surprise) "angel card" or "star card" with one word on it to give some focus in 2026.



In worship on Epiphany Sunday, January 4, individuals chose one "star word" that might be a guiding light in 2026.

The one word on the card is a value, a characteristic, or an action/practice. The word may be different if it is enacted or if it is received. For example, if your

word is "Mentor"— You may follow an urge to connect with a mentor (new or previous); you might feel called to offer being a mentor for someone(s) else; or maybe both. A word can have various meanings, and our first association with a word might not be the meaning we need to focus attention on. "Healing" can be physical, mental, emotional, or spiritual.

"Grief" might be about healthy processing of the death of a loved one— or grieving the loss of a job, home, relationship, physical ability, or something else. Essentially, what your word "means" could be varied or layered and may take some time to discern.

The Magi had to continue to discern how to follow God's lead— making their way from the east following the star... encountering King Herod... finding Jesus... listening to their dreams that told them to NOT return to Herod and to go home by another way. Your guiding word may make sense right away—or in four months, or at the end of the year.

You may have picked a word, or it may seem as though a word picked you.

Whether or not you are pleased with your word, I pray that you received a word that you need in this time of your life. You are invited to wonder and pray about it. Write about it and have conversation about it. And pray about it some more. Listen for God's leading.

If you were not physically in worship on January 4, and you would like a star word—please contact me, and I would be happy to prayerfully draw a word for you and let you know what that word is.

May God's light guide you — Pastor Michelle
