All: Christ is Risen Indeed!

MORNING PRAYER: (Unison)

All: God of grace and power, we have longed and prepared for this joyous day: on Ash Wednesday, we humbled ourselves before you; on Maundy Thursday, we learned a new Commandment; on Good Friday, we cried at the foot of the cross; on Holy Saturday, we kept vigil; and on this Blessed Sunday, we rejoice in the risen power of love, hope, and new life. Make this rising real in our own lives. Continue to inspire in us the joy of the Resurrection, to share the Good News with the world in word and deed. You have called us to be Your light in our world. May we share the Good News of the Resurrection: New Life begins now and is available for all. Call us into doing Your work, O God. *PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION/SCIPTURE READING – Mark 14:3-9

(Responsively)

L: Living God, today's Good News is so wondrous, so magnificent, that we struggle to wrap our heads around it. Give our hearts the wisdom to receive that which our heads cannot fully understand. Send your Spirit to fill our whole bodies with your resurrection promise. This we pray in your holy and good name. Amen.

L: When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back.

P: As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So, they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

SERMON: "WHAT KIND OF JESUS DO YOU WANT?" Pastor Clarissa

~EASTER COMMUNION~

- L: Dear Friends in Christ: the night is over! The morning is here!
- P: Christ is risen, risen as he said!
- L: Sadness has vanished! Tears are no more!
- P: Death has fled! Life is victorious!
- L: This is the day the Lord has made: (continued on insert)
- P: We rejoice! We are glad in it!
- L: Come, assemble for the Feast of Life,
- P: the Feast of the Kingdom of God! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
- L: Easter people, come now to the table with Christ!
- P: For he is risen! He lives and presides at this Feast!
- L: Come, eat together the Bread of Life!
- P: For he is risen, and nothing separates us from God's love!
- L: Come, drink together from the Cup of Gladness!
- P: For Christ is risen! Risen as he said! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

L: Praise to you, God of glory! You created the universe and all living things. You breathed life into our dust and gave us a paradise. You sought us when we hid ourselves, ashamed of our sin. You made a people for yourself and saved them from oppression. In the fullness of time, your love came also to us in your servant Jesus. He ministered to us, healing, overcoming divisions, welcoming all. He died on the cross of shame. But you vindicated him, giving him a life that is forever new! This is the life he shares with us: a life of justice, mercy, and citizenship in your realm of peace. All your creatures testify to your mighty deeds! They declare your everlasting love! We too proclaim it, as with the angels of heaven:

All: Holy, holy, Lord, God of power and might Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in

the highest!

Pastor: Now, O God, with grateful hearts we remember Jesus. **SILENCE**

Pastor: We remember that he was laid in a borrowed grave. A heavy stone sealed up the tomb. We remember that the women came, early in the morning, on the third day. They did not find him among the dead. We remember that his disciples met him on the road. He opened the Scriptures, explaining everything; and their hearts burned within them. They said to him, 'Stay with us, for it is evening.' So, he went in with them. And while they were at table, he took bread, gave thanks, and broke it for them to share. Then their eyes were opened, and they knew him in the breaking of the bread.

Come, Holy Spirit, bless this bread that earth has given, and human hands have made. Bless also this fruit of the vine, created for our gladness. Make them the food and drink of everlasting life, body surrendered, blood poured out.

As we rejoice in the resurrection, give us love for each other, and make us servants of peace, until your New Realm is revealed, and every creature beholds it. We pray in the name of Jesus, who lives and presides at this table, our host and our feast.

Blessed Trinity, in remembrance of all you have done to save us, we offer ourselves to you in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

ALL: Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus Christ with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen.**

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION: (Responsively)

L: Where is this Jesus, the one you call Messiah?

P: Christ is Risen! Christ is here among us!

L: I do not see him. I don't believe you.

P: Christ is Risen! Christ is here among us!

L: Let me see his body, his hands, and his feet.

P: We are Christ's body; We are Christ's feet.

L: You see the suffering in the world? Where is Jesus now?

P: We are going into the world to be the body of Christ.

L: Let us go together, let us partner with others.

P: For we are the body of Christ: let us share the Good News!

Pastor: Lord in your mercy: People: hear our prayer. PASTORAL PRAYER~

Pastor: Risen Lord, we have seen the empty tomb, and yet we sometimes act as if we have seen nothing. Why must we continue in fear? Why must we be afraid of death even after its defeat? Yes, this is a glorious day of mirth and song, but forgive us when we are quick to forget its Good News. Help us be a people of resurrection not just on this day but all days. Fill our hearts with your resurrection promise of life that we might turn from sin and be renewed. Eliminate from us the fear of sin that we might tell this glad story - that Christ is risen, he is risen, indeed! This we pray in the name of your Risen Son, Jesus Christ. We say together the words of the Lord's Prayer:

All: Our Father who art in heaven hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom the power and the glory, forever. Amen.
