CALL TO GATHER (UNISON)

All: Holy God, we embark on this Lenten journey grateful for your presence along the way. Walk alongside us to call us to repentance, to woo us from our idols, to open our eyes to our neighbor in need, to guide us in the way of sacrifice. Meet us in our fears and joys alike and sustain us in our weakness. Pour out your Spirit upon us, that these 40 days might become for us a journey that renews our hope, strengthens our faith, and prepares us for the agony of the cross as well as the new life of resurrection. Amen.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (Responsively)

- L: Confession is an act of trust. When we honestly name our sins, individual and corporate, to God, we trust that God receives our confession, because it is God's grace that empowers us to recognize our sin and repent. So, let us join our voices in confessing our sin before God and one another:
- L: Merciful God, we confess that too often we make choices about what we should and should not do based on what others will think of us. We seek the validation of family, friends, and even strangers instead of resting in our sacred worth and identity in you. And so, we travel the path of least resistance when we know that path does not align with yours.
- P: Forgive us, God, when we perform for one another instead of living with integrity in you.
- L: Merciful God, we confess that we place too much value on money, prestige, and influence. We live in a society that tells us we need more and more and more in order to live secure and satisfied lives, and we choose to live according to this lie to the detriment of ourselves and our neighbors.

- P: Forgive us, God, when we treasure wealth, status, possessions, and power over and above contrition, humility, generosity, and mutuality.
- L: Merciful God, we confess that we do not love you rightly. While we may love you with part of our lives, we do not love you as God with our whole lives. We resist your call to surrender our lives into your hands and to trust that you will care for us as individuals and as a community better than we could ever do on our own.
- P: Forgive us, God, when we point our hearts toward selfish gain instead of the lasting worth of life with you.

Prayers of silent confession.

- L: Receive this good news: we love because God first loved us. In the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven.
- P: In the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven.
- L: Repent and believe, for God's grace empowers us live in the humility of the beautiful and freeing truth that God is God, and we are not.

HOMILY PASTOR CLARISSA

INVITATION TO THE OBSERVANCE OF LENTEN DISCIPLINE

Pastor: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: the early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation. During this season converts to the faith were prepared for holy baptism; it was also a time when persons who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness and restored to participation in the life of the church. In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the church, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial, and by reading and meditation on God's holy word.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Pastor: We begin our Lenten observance by using the centuries-old symbol of ashes. By this we are reminded of our own frailty and mortality and called to humility and penitence.

People: Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May these ashes be to us a sign of our mortality, that we may remember that it is only by your gracious gift that we are given everlasting life. Amen.

Leader: Almighty and everlasting God,

People: We enter this season of Lent in penitence and humility, aware of our own mortality and sinfulness. Encourage us with your presence, we pray, that we may empty ourselves of whatever separates us from you and one another. Teach us to rely on no strength but yours, as we journey with your Son toward your kingdom through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
