She found two angels sitting where Jesus' burial linens were. Barely able to see them through the blur of her tears, she exclaimed, "They have taken away my Lord and I don't know where He is."

In a state of desperation, she turned back to go outside and ran into a gardener. She again cried out, "My Lord is missing, I have no idea where He is!" The gardener looked at her... and simply said, "Mary." Mary immediately exclaimed, "Rabboni" which was Aramaic for "Teacher."

I can't even express how much my heart lovingly aches when I read this interaction between Jesus and Mary, because this is the Lord, I know so well. My heart is beyond joyful at this sentiment. I can hear Jesus saying it! I feel His tenderness and His resurrective power in it.

Just like the joyful crowd on the first Palm Sunday, we had an amazing Easter worship service. The atmosphere was wonderful, the music was beautiful, and the message was meaningful. It was a great occasion and a great blessing to our wee church.

The same thing was happening all over the world. People gathered together to worship and praise Jesus as their Savior and Lord. To realize that almost 2 billion people across the planet were celebrating Christ's glorious resurrection is

staggering when you think about it. If only we could fulfill that potential every week in church and every day in the world! The Earth could be healed of its brokenness and perhaps we could all live-in peace. After all, Easter is a celebration of God healing sin and death with the actual resurrection of His Only Son. If we could only apply that in our relationships with other people, as well as our relations with other nations, what a dear and blessed planet this would be.
