Devotionals: 22 - 28 October 2023

John 13:34-35 - "Let me give you a new command: Love one another. In the same way I loved you, you love one another. This is how everyone will recognize that you are my disciples—when they see the love you have for each other."

John 13:34–35 Reminds us to love as Jesus loved. Not tomorrow, God, not even just kind of ambiguous, generally in the future, God today help us to love other followers of Christ in a way that shows those who are not followers of Christ what the love of Christ looks like in action.

This is the distinguishing mark of a disciple of Jesus. This is how people will know that we are followers of Jesus, when they see our love for each other.

Jesus calls us to a life that values others, serves others, and loves others. Not only does He call us to live this way, but He also modeled it for us.

In John 13 Jesus is getting increasingly closer to the cross; His time is coming, and things are intensifying.

In the verses prior Jesus is sharing a meal with His disciples. He's once again predicting His death and Judas' betrayal. In John 13:30 Judas leaves to go betray Jesus.

Now Jesus shifts gears: He begins to explain to the remaining disciples what He expects during His absence. The disciples don't really understand the gravity of the moment. But in the coming days they will begin to understand exactly what Jesus came to do and how everything is about to change. And the meaning of John 13:34-35 will take on a whole new life for them.

These words that Jesus say should carry with them some weight. We should lean in on what He's about to say because it's important that we understand AND live out this command. (John 13:34-35)

This passage should be one that every Christian has memorized and strives to live out daily. These are central to what God is calling each of us to do.

So, what is this new command? It's love. Something John talks a lot about in his Gospel, especially at the end. The Greek

words for "love" appear only 12 times in John 1-12, but in chapters 13-21 we find them 44 times.

But this isn't any kind of love; Jesus tells us we are to love as He loved. Remember He's about to go to the cross, the greatest act of love. And it's to this extent that we are to love those around us. Jesus displayed His love for us by going to the cross. Therefore, we are to love those around us with the same sacrificial love.

Yet many Christians fail to actually live this way and look no different from the world around them. And I think the meaning of John 13:34-35 is a powerful reminder and challenge to follow the example of Christ.

Now, it's interesting the first and greatest commandment is to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. And then the second commandment Jesus says is like it. "Love your neighbor as yourself." So why does Jesus say here, "this is the distinguishing mark of my disciples, they love one another."

John 13:34–35 describes what a disciple of Christ looks like. The distinguishing mark of a disciple of Christ is love for others. When we love God, we will have God's love for those around us.

Well, it makes sense, doesn't it? When we love God, when our hearts are tuned to God and God's heart, then we will have God's love for all people around us. And we will love just like Jesus said, just as He loves us, we will love one another. And then that love will mark Christian community. That love will mark the church and be a testimony to a watching world. Yet I fear, I'm guessing you might fear the same thing, that oftentimes that's not the testimony that we in the church give to the world around us.

Is this love and care and compassion for one another, this serving one another just like we see in John 13 as Jesus stoops to wash His disciples' feet. So, do we need to pray for this? Absolutely!

This verse calls us to love each one another.

Today Christians are known for a lot of things. But our love is not normally at the top of the list. But the meaning of John 13:34-35 challenges this. It's our sacrificial love that should be the distinguishing thing for followers of Jesus. We follow a God that gave up His life, not because we deserved it, but because we needed it.

When we love people, particularly difficult and messy people, we are showing those around us that the love of Christ is in us. It's how we set ourselves apart from the world. If you love one another the world will know that you follow Jesus.

In all our relationships, especially as Christians, disciples of Jesus, God please help us to love each other as you have called us to love Jesus. As you have shown us how to love, help us to serve each other. Our love for God is shown by how we love those around us. And if you want to live out the John 13:34-35 meaning then you need to live in God's grace. You need to understand what God has done for you so that you can do the same for others.

We pray increasingly that we would think less of ourselves and more of others. That our concern in the church would be for others' good, not for our own. Our constant prayer is for our Loving God to deliver us (God's people) from gossip, from undercutting one another, from showing a lack of love for one another. Deliver us from competing with one another, with comparing ourselves to one another. Help us to, in a Philippians 2 kind of way, look to others' interests above our own. God, we pray, as we humbly ask that in our homes, in our churches, our jobs, our relationships, may John 13 love be evident in us every day. We pray together:

Lord, let our memory provide no shelter for grievance against each other.

Lord, let our heart provide no harbor for hatred of each other.

Lord, let our tongue be no accomplice in the judgment of another. - Celtic Daily Prayer In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
