*CALL TO WORSHIP: (Responsively)

L: Are you awake? Are you alert?

P: Christ is coming into our lives in a new way.

L: Are you watching the signs?

L: Are you interpreting what is happening today?

P: Christ is coming into our lives in a new way.

L: Do you see opportunities for ministry?

*CALL TO RECONCILIATION:

L: How quickly we forget – our faith, our calling, our hope. All because we try to do everything our way, rather than God's. But God is quicker to forgive, and to restore us to new life. Let us confess to our God, as we pray, saying,

*PRAYER FOR FORGIVENESS: (Unison)

It is never easy to admit how foolish we are, Approaching God. You have chosen us for yourself, and we continue to shelter false gods in our hearts. You promise to be with us in every moment, but we can find little time for you. You send your Word to us, but we are too busy listening to the noise of our culture to pay attention.
