Harmonious Body

Unique gift

Once upon a time, there were some animals who decided to establish a school for animals. They agreed upon offering courses in running, climbing, swimming, and flying. They also decided that all animals should take every course. This is where the problem began. The duck was better than its teacher at swimming, but only received passing grades in flying and performed poorly in running. As a result, they made the duck drop swimming and stay after school to practice running. This caused the duck's webbed feet to become worn out and its grade in swimming dropped to average. However, everyone else felt less threatened and more comfortable with this arrangement, except for the duck.

The rabbit started off at the top of its class in running, but due to making up for missed swimming lessons, it caught pneumonia and had to drop out of school. The squirrel showed great talent in climbing but was extremely frustrated in flying class because the teacher insisted on starting from the ground up rather than the treetop down. As a result, the squirrel developed muscle cramps from overextension and received a "C" in climbing and a "D" in running. The eagle was the problem student and was disciplined for being a nonconformist. For example, in climbing class, the eagle would always reach the top of the tree before anyone else, but it insisted on using its own method to get there. Eventually, the eagle was expelled for refusing to participate in swimming class.

Does this story speak to you? What is the lesson here? God doesn't expect them to excel in every other area. When everyone is expected to fit into the same mold, it only leads to frustration, discouragement, mediocracy, and failure. A duck is meant to be a duck, not something else. God has made you unique so that you can accomplish what He wants you to achieve in the world. He doesn't want you to be anyone else; He wants you to be you.

Paul says that we all have unique gifts as a part of the body of Christ. Each body part has unique functions that are created to function that way. Hands have fingers that do wide range of movement. Feet have high sensory receptors to give balance to the body. The eye is a complex organ that works by bending light to create an image that the brain can understand. The heart pumps blood throughout the body, delivering oxygen and nutrients to organs and muscles. Each body part is miraculously complex in working together by the communicating signal, Neuron. Each body part is essential to the whole body.

Romans 12:6 says, "God has given each of us the ability to do certain things well." This is evident. The passage indicates that everybody has talents. If you say, "I don't have any talents," or "I don't have any abilities," you are mistaken. The problem is that you are more aware of

what you are not good at than what you are good at. The average human being has between five hundred and eight hundred abilities. Numerous studies have shown this. You have at least five hundred different abilities within you, many of which you may not even be aware of because they come naturally to you.

The problem arises when we go to school, as we are all treated in the same way. We take standardized tests like the SAT, ACT, or PSAT, which only measure one form of intelligence. As a result, we are all forced to learn in the same way, even though we have different abilities. According to Howard Gardner's theory, these include linguistic, logical-mathematical, musical, spatial, bodily-kinesthetic, interpersonal, intrapersonal, and naturalistic intelligence.

What intelligence do you possess? God equipped me with musical intelligence. I am very grateful because I love music. When I create music, I feel fulfilled, as I was made to make music. Each person in this space is wonderfully equipped with a specific talent. God designed us uniquely so that we can function best with the gifts given to us. There is great joy and fulfillment in life when you use your gift for the highest purpose.

Your Uniqueness in the Body of Christ

Are you celebrating yourselves? In the gifted area, we are geniuses. We need to recover the created genius that was not fully developed or noticed. God let me know not so long ago that the first gift is in the musical area, especially, making music. I am a person of age, but I still try to develop it more for the Lord. My gift is not for myself alone but to bless and strengthen other people in the body of Christ. I desire that it brings people's hearts to the Lord. Yours is the same.

So why did God give us unique gifts? Firstly, it is to serve and honor God by building a strong and effective body of the Lord. Let's consider what God did for you. God created you. God equipped you with special talents, spiritual gifts, and personality. Then He sent Jesus to die for you. I don't want to say "Yes."
