#### Friends.

November is the month of Thanksgiving. Let's contemplate and explore the significance of Thanksgiving in our spiritual journey.

Picture this: you're standing before magnificent gates, ornate and beautiful, leading to the presence of the King of Kings. How do you enter? Psalm 100:4 gives us the key: "Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise. Give thanks to Him and bless His name." This isn't just poetic language—it's a divine invitation and instruction. It's our daily passport into God's presence, our pathway to authentic worship. When we approach God with grateful hearts, we're not just being polite—we're participating in the very rhythm of Heaven itself.



What could be simple ways of practice? Pause a little bit, and name three specific things you're grateful for. Rain on your roof, a text from a friend, or simply waking up with breath in your lungs? When we begin our day with gratitude, we're literally opening the gate to His presence. We're saying, "Lord, I see You. I recognize Your hand in my life."

Each day, record one blessing and connect it to God's character. For example: "I'm grateful for my neighbor's kindness today—it shows me God's love through others," or "I'm thankful for strength to get through a difficult conversation—God's grace is sufficient." This practice trains our spiritual eyes to see God's fingerprints everywhere. It will become a testimony of God's faithfulness you can return to during difficult seasons.

When you catch yourself complaining—about traffic, weather, circumstances—pause and ask: "How can I reframe this with gratitude?" When you get stuck in traffic, you can say, "Lord, thank you for increasing patience in me!" And thanksgiving multiplies when shared. Make gratitude a regular part of your conversations, prayers, and service to others. At dinner, share what you're thankful for. In prayer groups, begin with thanksgiving before moving to requests. When serving others, do it with a grateful heart, recognizing that we give because we've first received.

When we express gratitude to others, we're creating a culture of thanksgiving that draws everyone closer to God's heart. We become conduits of God's grace, opening gates of blessing wherever we go. Friends, thanksgiving isn't just a holiday or a feeling—it's a way of life, a spiritual discipline that keeps us connected to God's heart, thanksgiving is a window through which blessings of God flows in.

This November, I challenge you to live the gateway life. Let thanksgiving be your daily key to God's presence. Enter His gates with thanksgiving, His courts with praise. You'll discover that the God who created the universe is intimately involved in the details of your life, and that realization will transform not just your prayers, but your entire perspective on life itself.


#### **Winter Preparation Event**










### FULL SHELF FOOD PANTRY WEST BEND

One of the most important theologians of the twentieth century illuminates the relationship between ourselves and the teachings of Jesus. What can the call to discipleship, the adherence to the word of Jesus, mean today to the businessman, the soldier, the laborer, or the aristocrat? What did Jesus mean to say to us? What is His will for us today? Drawing on the Sermon on the Mount, Dietrich Bonhoeffer answers these timeless questions by providing a seminal reading of the dichotomy between "cheap grace" and "costly grace." "Cheap grace," Bonhoeffer wrote, "is the grace we bestow ourselves...grace without discipleship...Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again, the girl which must be asked for, the door at which a man must know...It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life."

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF ACCOUNTABLE LEADERSHIP BOARD MEETING October 14, 2025

Opening Prayer and Devotion: Brett Barnett discussed Chapter 3 in the study book "Holy Currencies, 6 Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries" by Eric H.F. Law. He talked about relationships and the attitudes of sharing – doing more with less. After the discussion, Pastor Hae-Jeong had members get into pairs. Each would ask for prayers for something in their lives, and the other would pray for that person. Pastor Hae-Jeong said a prayer for all.

#### Treasurer's Report: Doug Fitzgerald for Eric Peters

Doug reviewed the Foundation Funds, Elaine Gust Fund, and Cash Reserve Accounts. The checkbook balance is \$3,100.

#### Trustees Report: Brett Barnett

- A. Budget: Doug Fitzgerald is working with Brett regarding the budget.
- B. Capital Fundraiser: A fundraiser will be established to provide funds for the roof, Air Conditioning, resealing the parking lot, redecorating the church, and any other issue that may arise.

#### Technology Team: Brett Barnett for the Technology Team

- A. There currently is an issue with the internet as Spectrum i doing a city-wide upgrade. Discussion was held regarding possible additional money to Spectrum for a static IP address to guarantee service (ALB questioned that would work). Technology felt there was room in the budget for it. The "Tom's" will look into information from other providers (such as AT&T, etc.)
- B. Discussion was also held on the various phone and internet lines.
- C. Technology will get more information regarding an updated loop system (\$5,000-\$6,000). Carpet installers are questioning whether wiring is needed under the carpet. This is being reviewed.

#### Memorials & Missions: Thomas Thomas

There was a meeting on November 11th. Thomas will follow up with Tom Bast regarding having Wills & Memorials as a separate charge, not in the budget. The only account left is the Susan Haag account. The rest of the money was used for Outreach and Charities. Regarding the new carpeting, Wills & Memorials is waiting for the color selection. A group is coming in to give input on decorating, etc. Trustees will wait until that is done before having the carpeting installed.

#### Christian Education: Kathy Schneider

- A. Kids Ministry is progressing teachers and aides are in place. They are working on a skit for the Christmas potluck on Sunday, December 14th.
- B. Youth Fellowship will be packing "Soles for Souls" shoes on Sunday, November 9th.

#### United Women in Faith: Jenny Korbar

UWF is down to six (6) true members. UWF would like to withdraw from umbrella of the Conference. They would still do fundraising for the community. The Cookie Bake Sale would be only for the congregation. After discussion, a **Motion** was made by Doug Fitzgerald, second by Kathy Schneider, to give permission for the FAUMC UWF to withdraw from the Conference. **Motion Carried.** 

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF ACCOUNTABLE LEADERSHIP BOARD MEETING OCTOBER 14, 2025—Page 2 of 2

#### Pastor's Report: Rev. Dr. Hae-Jeong Yoon

- A. Charge Conference will be held at 1:00 p.m., Sunday, December 7th.
- B. The ALB meeting will be moved to December 2<sup>nd</sup> to enable review of the information and make any changes.
- C. Three (3) people from the community asked for some monetary support. Pastor provided funds from the Pastor's Fund, as well as her personal funds. Brett Barnett also helped to repair a car issue.
- D. Homeless Winter Event: Pastor used \$150 from Pastor's fund to purchase more jackets.
- E. Audio Devotions 40 days finished need feedback whether it is useful or not.

#### Finance Report: Doug Fitzgerald

- A. Doug provided a summary of the 2026 budget requests and a memo highlighting some subjects related to the summary. Discussion was held and some budget amounts were amended.
- B. Kaonou Latham stated the Conference made some changes to the way the Pastor's pension is calculated. Also, the Apportionment has increased.
- Pastor Hae-Jeong discussed budget to include money needed for worship studies series.
- D. A Capital Campaign for Trustees needs was also discussed.
- E. Doug will amend the budget figures, and it will be presented to the Charge Conference for approval.
- F. Doug attached a memo regarding the status of the last fund transfer request to the United Methodist Foundation. A Motion was made by Kaonou Latham, second by Doug Fitzgerald, to approve the wording to the Memorandum of Understanding, Paragraph 4, "The Estates Fund of West Bend Fifth Ave UMC is a board designated account. Disbursements will be made to West Bend Fifth Ave UMC at the direction of the Accountable Leadership Board and used for purposes designated by the Accountable Leadership Board consistent with policies and rules adopted by the Accountable Leadership Board for management and use of the Estates Fund." Motion Carried.
