Are Your Prayers Answered?

One thing God has made abundantly clear to me is that prayers are always answered. While some prayers are answered immediately, others may be answered at the right time, even if not immediately. In some cases, prayers may take a very long time to be answered, such as 10, 20, or even 30 years.

Book of Revelation 8:3-5 states that the prayers of the saints rise with the incense of the angel before the throne of God. The rising incense symbolizes that these prayers are heard, valued, and ascend to God. Then the rising prayers are answered by God. God has great joy in answering our prayers, and these answered prayers deepen our faith.

However, there are prayers that don't rise to the throne. Unfortunately, 80% of our prayers don't reach God, while only 20% are heard. Why is this? If your urgent prayers remain unanswered, your heart loses the courage to pray again.

There are crucial elements we should understand from the Bible. It's Hebrews 11:6, which states, "And without faith it is impossible to please God, for anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him" (NIV). This verse emphasizes the importance of believing in God's reality and recognizing that He rewards those who diligently search for Him.

Is God REAL to you? It's the central focus of answered prayers. God isn't distant or vague; He's incredibly real, just like the chair you're sitting on, the cup you're drinking from, or the phone you're using. God knows every aspect of your life, even the smallest details like the number of hairs on your head. He knows you better than you know yourself because He created you. When you search for Him, He becomes tangible—a person who is infinitely loving and powerful, sitting right next to you.

The next step is to speak to God with YOUR HEART. If your heart isn't poured in your own words, your prayers won't be heard. When you speak to God, you speak from your current state, pouring out your heart, whether it's pain, worry, depression, drug addiction, or alcoholism. You're to speak from your heart. Then, your prayers ascend to the throne, and God answers powerfully with "peals of thunder, rumblings, flashes of lightning, and an earthquake." (Rev. 8:5)

God guides you, God heals you, God restores you, God reveals heavenly wisdom when you needed to discern an important decision when you pour your heart in your own language. It is the way that your prayers are heard, and always heard. Do not hide anything at all. Frankly speak, what you cannot do at all.

Your life and struggles should be the first things you pray for. After that, you can continue praying for your family and friends, your community, and the nation. You can also pray for peace and justice in the world. It's like a stone dropped into a pond, creating ripples that spread outward.

Talk to Jesus always through prayer, asking questions, seeking guidance, in all big and small things of life. There is no small things to God. God is delighted to listen and answer your prayers.



HIGHLIGHTS OF ACCOUNTABLE LEADERSHIP BOARD MEETING August 5, 2025

Finance Report: Doug Fitzgerald

Doug Fitzgerald discussed resolutions for authorization of tracking future gifts. A **Motion** was made by Brett Barnett, and seconded by Kathy Schneider, to accept the resolutions giving the Finance Chair authorization for future gifts & bequests. **Motion Carried.**

Doug provided a handout of the 2025 account summary for the UM Foundation Legacy Fund and Parsonage Fund, as well as the Elaine Gust and Betty Nelson funds. There was further discussion regarding the Betty Nelson fund. A **Motion** was made by Brett Barnett, seconded by Alana Dalton, to approve the removal of the Betty Nelson fund from the Foundation and put into a money market account or CDs. **Motion Carried.**

Treasurer's Report: Eric Peters

Income: The YTD (2025) total income gain is \$122,409 with a budgeted amount for the entire year of \$395,825. This is 30.93% of the budgeted amount for the current year. July 2025 pledged/unpledged amounts are down \$8,147 compared to June 2025. (Note: This YTD percentage will likely not reach 100% since we budget for future expenses & not income)

Expenses. Total YTD (2025) expenses are \$233, 114 with a budgeted amount for the year of \$395,825. This is 58.89% of the budgeted amount for the current year.

Booked Income: The booked income YTD (2025) loss is -\$110,705.

Investment Income: YTD foundation withdrawal is \$210,424. YTD foundation Deposits are \$0. Current checking has \$24,278 balance as of July 31, 2025.

Parsonage Fund: YTD Parsonage withdrawal is \$6,000. YTD parsonage total deposits \$0.00. We are using money to pay utilities & maintenance with this fund. Current balance in 40213 is \$3,383. July 2025 Utilities/ Maintenance amount for parsonage was \$176.00.

Notes from Eric:

- * Stock Market was down for July 2025.
- * Unpledged/Pledged amounts are down compared to June 2025. July is the lowest month for income this year, and we are spending most in Maintenance & Insurance.
- * Expenses are up for July, mostly in Maintenance and Insurance.
- * We took out \$60,423.79 withdrawal from Foundation this past month.
- * We need to focus on more income & cautionary measures for our expenses.

A **Motion** was made by Kathy Schneider, seconded by Doug Fitzgerald to approve the report. **Motion Carried.** Discussion was held regarding the increased cost of insurance (doubled) and the increase in the building value. Kathy inquired as to whether we can determine the months we have the biggest hits. Doug will review the last five (5) years of the financial reports and provide information.

Trustees: Brett Barnett

Brett said that there was no Trustees meeting. The ALB meeting was moved up a week.

- **A. Senior Dining Negotiations:** Brett provided them with a proposal for Senior Dining, which would include additional costs for trash and utilities. Sharon has presented it to the County.
- B. **Carpeting:** Trustees have two (2) estimates, and are waiting on a third from Polly Bertelsen.
- C. **Roof:** Roofer repaired this end at no charge.
- D. Lawn: The lawn landscaping is completed and the drainage fixed.
- E. **Youth Room:** Kathy Scheider had discussed with Brett the need for new blinds in the youth room. Brett will present to Trustees at next meeting. When approved, Kathy will ask Wills & Memorials for money for the new blinds.


