
- **P:** In the name of the Father, ★ Son, and Holy Spirit.


ADVENT PROPHECY Isaiah 64:1-9

Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence— ² as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil — to make your name known to your adversaries, and that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome things that we did not look for, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From of old no one has heard or perceived by the ear, no eye has seen a God besides you, who acts for those who wait for him. You meet him who joyfully works righteousness, those who remember you in your ways. Behold, you were angry, and we sinned; in our sins we have been a long time, and shall we be saved? We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls upon your name, who rouses himself to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have made us melt in the hand of our iniquities. But now, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. Be not so terribly angry, O Lord, and remember not iniquity forever. Behold, please look, we are all your people.

EPISTLE LESSON 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus, ⁵that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge— ⁶ even as the testimony about Christ was confirmed among you— ⁷ so that you are not lacking in any gift, as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ⁸ who will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

HOLY GOSPEL Luke 1:5-23

In the days of Herod, king of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, of the division of Abijah. And he had a wife from the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. ⁶ And they were both righteous before God, walking blamelessly in all the commandments and statutes of the Lord. ⁷ But they had no child, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were advanced in years. ⁸ Now while he was serving as priest before God when his division was on duty, ⁹ according to the custom of the priesthood, he was chosen by lot to enter the temple of the Lord and burn incense. ¹⁰ And the whole multitude of the people were praying outside at the hour of incense. "And there appeared to him an angel of the Lord standing on the right side of the altar of incense. 12 And Zechariah was troubled when he saw him, and fear fell upon him. 13 But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. 14 And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, 15 for he will be great before the Lord. And he must not drink wine or strong drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb. 16 And he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God, ¹⁷ and he will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to make ready for the Lord a people prepared." ¹⁸ And Zechariah said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years." 19 And the angel answered him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you

and to bring you this good news. ²⁰ And behold, you will be silent and unable to speak until the day that these things take place, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time." ²¹ And the people were waiting for Zechariah, and they were wondering at his delay in the temple. ²² And when he came out, he was unable to speak to them, and they realized that he had seen a vision in the temple. And he kept making signs to them and remained mute. ²³ And when his time of service was ended, he went to his home.


PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.

Communion Participation: As Lutheran Christians, we believe Christ's body and blood are truly present with the bread and wine, offering forgiveness of sins to all who believe in Jesus Christ. We ask those who commune to share this unity of faith in Christ and understanding of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Since the Scripture teaches that we are to examine ourselves before eating of the bread and drinking of the cup (1 Corinthians 11:28), if you are not certain of the meaning of Holy Communion or have not been baptized or instructed in the Christian faith, please speak with the Pastor before communing.

Communion Distribution Process: Please form two lines in the main center aisle, proceeding to the altar. After you have received communion, you may return to your pew via the side aisles.



White grape juice is provided in the center of the trays. Individual cups may be placed in the baskets provided by the acolyte. Gluten-free bread is available upon request.

Communion and Children: First communion is ordinarily offered at Hope to youth after instruction classes in the 5th grade. Children and youth who have not been confirmed may come to the altar to receive a blessing. Children and non-confirmed youth should fold their arms over their chest to acknowledge they are receiving the blessing.





Hope's Beginnings: 27 Years Ago

The beloved church that we know and love today first began to take shape in May 1995. At that time, the leadership of Our Savior Lutheran Church in Raleigh and Resurrection Lutheran Church in Cary partnered with the Southeastern District of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod to purchase the property of St. Catherine of Siena Catholic Church in Wake Forest. Gatherings for Bible study and mission planning continued through 1996. Rev. Preston Wagner, then the Southeastern District Executive for Mission and Ministry, was called to be Mission Developer for the Wake Forest Lutheran Mission.

Pastor Wagner began his ministry in October 1996, and was formally installed as Mission Developer/Pastor on December 1, 1996. The first regular church service, with 126 people in attendance, was held on December 8, 1996. The Lutherans shared the stone church at 701 S. Main Street with St. Catherine of Sienna Catholic Church for seven months.

The Wake Forest Lutheran Mission formally organized and chartered on Pentecost Sunday, May 18, 1997. The name "Hope Lutheran Church" was selected by the 91 communicant and 129 baptized members. In August 1997, the church launched the ministry of Hope Lutheran Preschool with 48 students and six teachers. Regina Fisher began serving as Director of Christian Education and Preschool Director. Pastor Wagner, who had been serving as Mission Developer for the Southeastern District, was officially called as Hope's permanent pastor and was installed at the 1st anniversary service in December 1997. At the end of the first full year of ministry, Hope had 139 communicant and 206 baptized members. Average worship attendance for the year was 116.



From these humble beginnings, God has made amazing things happen through our church. The congregation moved to its present location in 2003, building a preschool and multi-use facility. As the congregation continued to grow, the people of Hope embarked on a major facility expansion that includes our current sanctuary, adult education center, youth center, and administrative offices.

This year, in 2023, we are celebrating 27 years of Christ-centered ministry in the Wake Forest community. Hope Lutheran Church has been abundantly blessed in countless ways. Our church has grown with its community, and we are privileged to witness God's hand at work in the lives of his people. Hope's diverse worship services, stimulating adult education classes, and hands-on ministry events are helping build strong lives of faith for disciples of all ages. Our outstanding preschool, children, and youth ministries provide a family-friendly, Christ-centered environment, and help keep our congregation young and vital. Hope is blessed with many volunteers that joyfully "proclaim and live the Word and love of Christ" to people in our community.

Our church was founded with a mission vision, and that vision remains alive and well today. The ministry of Hope extends beyond our walls, as the people of Hope are sent forth into God's mission fields week after week. Even as we celebrate our past today, may the people of Hope joyfully recommit themselves to doing God's work in our community for many years to come!

My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness; No merit of my own I claim, but wholly lean on Jesus' name. On Christ the solid rock I stand; all other ground is sinking sand.
