Isaiah 7:10-14

HOLY GOSPEL Luke 2:1-20

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶ And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

⁸ And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. ¹⁰ And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹ For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,



Adopt-A-Highway

As part of Hope Lutheran's commitment to serving the Wake Forest community, Hope has adopted Forestville Road, between Rogers Road and Burlington Mills Road. Four times a year a clean-up day is organized, and volunteers spend time picking up trash that has accumulated on the sides of Forestville Road.

Might to Shine

Night to Shine is a prom held annually in February for people (ages 14+) with special needs. The goal of the evening is to celebrate our honored guests with corsages/boutonnieres, crowns, a red carpet walk, professional photos, a photo booth, karaoke, limo rides, appetizers, a DJ, and a dance floor. Volunteers will be needed to help with a myriad of fun tasks. Night to Shine 2024 will take place on Friday, February 9.

ESL Classes

English as Second Language classes will be held at Hope on both Tuesdays and Thursdays, 6:00-8:00PM, January 16 - March 7, 2024. The classes are for anyone in the community who would like to practice English and is willing to commit to a six-week session. The minimum age is 18. Mobile Food Ministry

Hope's Mobile Food Ministry is an initiative that began after disaster response volunteers saw Gulf Coast Lutheran volunteers cooking and serving meals to survivors, recovery workers and volunteers after hurricanes. Volunteers from Hope's version of this ministry, now turning two years old, originally jumped in with both feet at the opportunity to serve hot, hearty meals to refugees in the Raleigh area. The group then began experimenting with different recipes that can be cooked in the field and served en masse after disasters, testing the model by partnering in different community food security events. A little over a year ago, the ministry received grants and donations and was able to purchase a used equipment trailer. Shortly thereafter, the food ministry responded to the Hedingham (Raleigh) mass shooting, serving hundreds of meals in that neighborhood just 24 hours after the devastating losses of a police officer and four other neighbors. Hope's Mobile Food Ministry has continued serving alongside various groups in the community, practicing the feeding model and acquiring the necessary equipment to be able to deploy to a natural disaster in the southeast or beyond.

Kids & Youth

Preschool Jam

Preschool Jam is programing for 3, 4, and 5 year olds. The primary focus is building a foundation that allows for children to gain an understanding of who Jesus is, and how he is part of their life. This group participates in family programing to allow for an environment of fellowship and fun.

K1 Crew

K1 Crew is for our Kindergarteners and first graders. This group builds off of the lessons learned in preschool and works on developing their relationship is Jesus as well as with Christian friends. This group participates in a combination of family fellowship activities as well as activities just for them specifically.

Level 23

Level 23 is for our 2nd and 3rd grade kids. This group focuses on Bible literacy. Learning how to navigate and find verses in the Bible as well as starting to connect Bible learnings to their personal lives. This group's milestone is to receive a Bible in their 2nd or 3rd grade year. They participate in a combination of family fellowship activities as well as activities just for them specifically.

Plub 45

Club 45 is for 4th and 5th grade kids. This group spends two years going through a Bible Overview as a preparation for Confirmation classes (in 6th and 7th grade). They spend time learning about prayer and how to feel comfortable praying to God within a group. This group's milestone is to receive first communion in the 5th grade after attending a 3 weekly classes in January. They participate in a combination of family fellowship activities as well as activities just for them specifically.

Middle (School

Here we focus on our Middle Schoolers (6-8 Grade) not only having fun and making friends but also learning about God. Our discussions center around how to live as young people of God, using his word as our guide. Youth group meets Wednesday nights where we play games and eat snacks all while hearing what God to says to us.

High School

Hope's youth learn what it means to be a child of God amidst the world we face today. Each month we dive into a hot topic that effects the youth's daily life, all paired up with fun food and friends. Youth group meets weekly on Sunday nights with monthly events, and pop-up events. These events can be anything from Lock-in's to meeting for lunch at Culvers.
