## STORMS NEVER LAST?

A few months ago, I received a strong response to a devotional I wrote for the newsletter, referencing an old rock song by Ringo Starr. To give equal time to another favorite music genre, I'd like to invite you to focus with me for a moment on a favorite old country song, recorded by Jessi Colter and Waylon Jennings. "Storms Never Last" is a slow-moving, lyrical ballad, and the singers' soaring harmonies are memorable. The lyrics of the chorus go like this.

Storms never last, do they, baby Bad times all pass with the winds Your hand in mine stills the thunder And you make the sun want to shine

It's a love song, and the singers express a really nice, positive view about the power of love to help us through life's troubles. The song talks about the hardships and trials of life, and makes the point that those struggles never last, just as storms in nature always pass.

I like hopeful, positive songs, and maybe you do, too. But some folks who are reading this devotional might be going through storms that just aren't going away. Sometimes our seasons of human suffering are brief, but sometimes those seasons seem interminable. Yes, it's a great blessing to have a human loved one to share life's hard times. The hard truth, though, is that even the power of love doesn't always "still the thunder." Clinging to the hand of a loved one is a powerful thing, but – with all respect to Jessi and Waylon -- that doesn't always "make the sun want to shine," does it?

There is one loved one, though, who is the Master of the storms. There is one, and only one, who can still the thunder and control the sun's shining. There is one hand to cling to that is stronger and more efficacious than any other. There is one love that far surpasses all others, and that makes the supreme difference when you and I are going through stormy seasons.

Jesus. Only Jesus.

Cling to him. Pray to him. Immerse yourself in his Word. Trust in his love. Believe in his promise to see you through this life's storms, and to share the blissful, storm-free, never-ending life in heaven with you. Only in Christ Jesus do "storms never last!"


All persons interested in becoming members of Hope or transferring their membership from another Lutheran church are invited. There is no obligation to join by attending the class!

#### CONGREGATION NEWS

Hope's Congregational Assembly met on Sunday, January 29, and took some important steps together to advance and support our mission, as "the people of Hope Lutheran Church proclaim and live the Word and love of Christ."



The Call Team presented a report on the search process for an Associate Pastor. Over the past months, the focus has been on candidates from the field, who are currently serving in other congregations. A great deal of work has been done in this part of the search, as the Call Team has reviewed a total of 28 candidates. Many of them would be viable candidates for the position, but are not currently available, are not willing to be considered at present, or were removed from consideration for a variety of reasons. The Call Team consequently presented a recommendation for the congregation extend a Call for a seminary candidate to be placed as Hope's Associate Pastor, and that recommendation was approved by the Congregational Assembly. Three candidates were interviewed by the Call Team earlier this month, and the Call requests placement following a preferred ranking. There is no guarantee that a candidate will be placed at Hope, as many congregations are seeking placements from the seminary, and the number of graduates is low. The official announcement regarding placement of a seminary candidate at Hope will be made in late April. Pray for God's Spirit to guide this placement process in every way.

Hope's Ministry Leadership Team, along with the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer, proposed a 2023 Ministry Budget, which was approved by the Congregational Assembly. We are deeply thankful for all those who support the Lord's work here at Hope with gifts and offerings, and we pray for God's blessings on our common ministry in 2023.

# Volunteers Needed


We need volunteers for our Night to Shine event on February 10. Volunteers will be needed to help with a myriad of fun tasks, such as:






