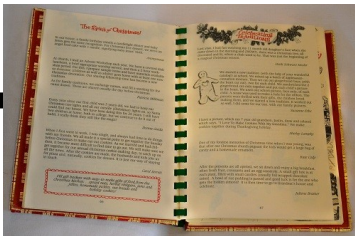

**Currently Studying – The International Lesson Series:** Uniform Series in a 6-year plan for reading and studying the Bible.
