What is the Baptism of the Holy Spirit?

- The privilege of being permanently placed into the body of Christ. This unrepeatable act of the Holy Spirit unifies all believers with Christ and one another at the moment of salvation (1Cor. 12:12-13).

1 Cor. 12:12-13

- ¹² For just as the body is one and has many members, and **all** the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³ **For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body**—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free and **all** were made to drink of one Spirit.

The Indwelling, Filling, and Baptism of the Spirit

- The **Indwelling** of the Spirit is His *Personal Presence* in the Believer; The **Filling of the Spirit** is His *Perpetual Power* through the Believer; **The Baptism of the Spirit** is His *Permanent Partnership* with the Believer.

- 1) **The Indwelling:** His Personal Presence (1 Cor. 3:16; 1 Cor. 6:19-20)
- 2) **The Filling of the Spirit:** His Perpetual Power (Eph. 5:18)
- 3) **The Baptism of the Spirit:** His Permanent Partnership (1 Cor.12:13)
