What are the Side Effects of Salvation?

- **Justification (5:1).** In exchange for our 'guilty status' before God (that we earned) we now have a 'Righteous Status' before God as a Gift.

What are the Side Effects of Salvation?

- **Peace and Reconciliation with God (5:1;11).** In exchange for being under the wrath of God as enemies, we are under the Love of God as family.

What are the Side Effects of Salvation?

- **Access to God's Grace (5:2).** In exchange for being separated from God, we now have full access to God and His resources of grace.

What are the Side Effects of Salvation?

- **Hope in the 'Glory of God' (5:2).** In exchange for being conformed to a distorted and destructive image, we are being conformed to the image (glory) of Christ.

What are the Side Effects of Salvation?

- **The 'Much More' Mercies of God (5:9, 10, 15, 17).** In exchange for storing up 'wrath for the day of wrath,' we are confirmed by the abundance of God's redeeming and transformative Love.

- **Reason for Rejoicing (5:2, 3,11).** In exchange for being sentenced to a life of grief, we have been conditioned for celebration in every situation

The Side Effects of Salvation

Romans 5:1-11

- 2) **God's Vision for Your Life**
- 3) **God's Validation for Your Life**

God's Verdict Over Your Life

(5:1-2)

- Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. ² Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand,

God's Vision for Your Life
(5:2b-5)

• and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope,

God's Vision for Your Life
(5:2b-5)

• ⁵ and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

God's Validation for Your Life
(5:6-11)

• ⁶ For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die

God's Validation for Your Life
(5:6-11)

•⁸ **but God shows his love** for us in that **while we were still sinners**, Christ died for us. ⁹ Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, **much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God.**

God's Validation for Your Life
(5:6-11)

•¹⁰ For if **while we were enemies** we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, **much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life.** ¹¹ More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom **we have now received reconciliation.**
