

Come to me...receive rest. Here's my yoke, go ahead and make it your own. It really is easy, following my way of life. No heavy burdens from me! (Matt. 11: 28-30 - Brad Miller paraphrase) •

So what's this **yoke** again?

A yoke in Jesus' day, and not that long ago, was what farmers used – a kind of collar to link animals together, and then attached to something like a plow. This helped them pull together.

Jesus applies this image to our life with Him. In his context as a Rabbi, he's talking about following him, being linked to him, learning to live an everyday way of life that is modeled after his life. In the words of John Mark Comer.

- 1. Be with Jesus
- 2. Become like Jesus
- 3. Do what he would do if he were you

Another way this invitation of Jesus could be said is... rearrange your life to look and live and love like me. You'll be at my side, learning to let me shoulder the weight of all the stuff you're carrying, AND to experience my deep rest along the way.

This yoke is not heavy...filled with all kinds of shoulds and rules and pressure and trying harder. You belong to Jesus! Take that in! His yoke, the way of life he's calling you to is easy...it's lighter because he's got you!!

Have you responded to Jesus's invitation?

You've probably heard the phrase "live a life of example." As Christ followers, we get to show what it looks like to follow Jesus and receive an easy yoke - a burden that is light. Last month I challenged us to think about what we say "yes" to, so that we can leave room for where God might be calling us.

If you leaned into that challenge (it's not too late if you haven't yet), you may be starting to see and experience an easy yoke, with fresh new spaces for God to move in your week. Is God inviting you to reach out to others so that you can lighten their load, ease their burden, and share with them the easy yoke given when we follow Jesus?

Follow Me

As a kid I remember my mom saying, "Be careful who you hang out with, because you will become *like them."* That is really what this series *Follow Me* is all about, becoming more like Jesus by arranging our lives around being with Him and learning from Him.

In Jesus day there were two specific marks that every Rabbi or religious teacher had. The first was their yoke when was their set of teachings and how they lived their lives. For example, the Pharisees taught that people needed to carry the yoke following all the laws of the Torah, plus their own 613 laws, it was a heavy burden for people to carry. What made Jesus unique is that He claimed that His yoke is easy and light; that it is not a burden.

The second mark of a Rabbi were followers. These followers were more than roadies hoping to get a alimpse of their favorite singer, they were doing their very best to shape every aspect of their lives around their Rabbi. In Jesus day the common practice was for followers to choose their Rabbi, but Jesus turned that upside down, He chose His disciples. The point was to learn by watching and then modeling their lives after what they saw. So often we think of learning as only happening in a formal classroom setting, but the truth is much of what we learn is caught by observing and not just taught.

Jesus invites us to wear a different yoke from the world when He says, "Get away with Me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with Me and work with Me-watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace." Notice that we find rest as we walk with and learn from Jesus.

The yoke that Jesus offers us is His way of life. To wear the yoke of Jesus means that we rearrange our lives to spend time with Him so that our lives will reflect His life and all that was important to Him including the pace and rhythms of His life.

So, what are we waiting for? Whether we realize it or not we will always be wearing a yoke, lets make it the light and easy yoke of Jesus. I just love how author John Mark Comer says it, "An easy life is not an option, an easy yoke is."

At the end of this month, October 26-28, we will be hosting our annual Feed My Starving Children Mobile Pack. This event is filled with high energy fun and results in food packed for kids across the globe. During our event, we have the goal of packing over 200,000 meals which will feed over 550 kids for 1 year. We cannot accomplish that goal without you! These packing sessions provide opportunities for all ages and abilities. Here is an inside look to what happens during a 2-hour packing session:

<u>Opening</u>- when you arrive, you will hear about FMSC, the work they do and the impact of the food. You will also receive instructions on how to participate in various roles during the session.

<u>Packing Session</u>- there are 3 areas you can serve in:

- Labeling: if you love stickers, have kids under the age of 5, or can't stand for long periods of time- this is for you! You will place stickers with important information onto the food bags before they get packed.
- Food Packing: if you like being a part of the main action,

don't have a soy allergy, and can stand for 1.5 hours- this is for you! You will partake in the stations that fill the bags with food, seal them and pack them into boxes.

Warehouse: if you like getting a workout in, moving at a face pace and lifting heavy thingsthis is for you! You will collect boxes from tables, fill bins with ingredients to keep the stations packing, and place boxes on pallets so they are ready to ship.

<u>Closing</u>- you'll gather back together with everyone in your session to hear about and celebrate how many meals you packed, and how many kids you fed. You'll also hear about opportunities available to continue to support the work of FMSC.

There are a few other areas you can serve if you desire to take a supportive role to our Mobile Pack. Our team needs greeters at every shift to welcome people in and guide them to the right location, volunteers who are willing to help check people in, and volunteers who want to help with food hospitality for FMSC staff and WLC lead volunteers. As we continue our "Follow Me" series, delving into spiritual disciplines that bring us rest, I want to draw your attention to focus on a profound invitation from our Lord: "Take up my yoke and learn from me, for my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:29).

Our call to action is simple: take up His invitation for us to "Follow Me." Let's commit to a lifestyle of worship, not confined to a building but woven into the fabric of our daily lives. Seek moments of worship in your day—offer a prayer of thanksgiving, meditate on Scripture, or sing a song of praise.


Over the past several months, Woodbury Lutheran Church has encountered a season of change that is truly visible in our ministries, our buildings, and how we interact with each other.


One new venture that we launched in June 2023 is the WLC Estate Planning Ministry. More than 70 WLC members took part in an estate planning seminar moderated by our ministry partner, Financial Planning Ministry, resulting in over 30 estate plans created at no out-of-pocket cost to our members. With this great success, we are pleased to announce that WLC will host another "Wills and Trust" seminar at our Oak Hill campus on November 14th. A webinar will take place on November 16th for those that cannot attend in person. Please stay tuned to the Church Center app and wlc.church for more information and how to register in the coming weeks.

Another big change is our transition to Church Center. Our staff and key volunteer leaders have spent an incredible amount of time and effort to successfully launch Church Center in early September. You have likely seen the new check-in stations with name tags, a new phone app, and a new giving platform. Once fully implemented, Church Center will streamline and improve church engagement and communication at a significantly lower cost to WLC. Thank you to all that have already moved their online giving to Church Center, which saves WLC approximately 1% per transaction. For those that have not, our staff is ready and willing to assist you in making the change.

Finally, I would like to thank you for your generosity in allowing us to invest in improving each of our properties. These investments include land reclamation, a new nursery, and a new roof and siding at Oak Hill, new WLCkids spaces and courtyard improvements at Wakota Ridge, and improved security and bathroom spaces in our preschool. None of this would have happened without the consistent generosity of our members.

Thank you for your generosity of time, abilities, and finances that enable us as a church body to achieve our vision of *Multiplying Disciples, Transforming Lives*.

In the hustle and bustle of life, resting, let alone working from a place of restedness and peace can seem impossible. As we journey together as disciples of Jesus, we are reminded of Jesus's invitation to be yoked with Him, doing life His way... and experiencing a lighter burden.

In Matthew 11:28-30, Jesus invites us, saying, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

The imagery of a yoke and the work entailed might seem daunting, but Jesus assures us that His yoke is not one of oppression or hardship. Instead, it is a way of life marked with love, grace, freedom, purpose, rest and a deep awareness that we're not navigating anything alone.

In our non-stop world, the concept of rest can seem impossible. Jesus teaches us the importance of setting aside time to rest and reconnect with Him. The Sabbath is a gift from our Creator, an invitation to intentionally pause, worship, and ask Jesus to put us back together... to rest so we are ready to take on the challenges coming our way.

Sabbath resting can help to set us free from the temptation to believe that our efforts, achievement, accrual of things, and that what we produce is what give our lives value. It's a practice in trusting. An act of worship. An act of obedience that the Holy Spirit uses to transform our hearts.

As families, what could it look like to practice working from our rest together? Setting aside moments regularly to remind each other of who we are as loved children of God. To notice and help each other name when we have picked up a different yoke than what Jesus offers. Maybe one of these very tempting yokes looks like: people pleasing, proving our value through exhausting efforts, or depending

on our stuff to find security. Or just maybe it can look like:

- disconnecting from screens for a few hours or for a day.
- making a day's worth of meals ahead of time so that a Saturday or Sunday doesn't require meal prep but instead includes family chill time around a fire or going for a hike?
- an afternoon set aside to have an hour of reflection and prayer and then a family meal and a game or walk after.

I'm continually reminded that living the disciple life is not anchored in "doing all the right things" but instead a journey of asking the Holy Spirit to show me how I can know Him more and live my life His way. Resting looks different for each of us. Let's each ask for help to lay down any yokes that we have grown comfortable wearing so we can experience the rested, freedom of Jesus' way.

Choosing Who We Follow

Fall Leaves!

Do you have leaves that you need to dispose of? Bring them to the WLC garden on the Afton property (NE corner of Bailey and Manning) any time after October 20. I'm sure you've had times where you've needed help to lift something or move something that is just too heavy or too large for you to move by yourself. What is a good solution to this problem? You find someone to help you! And together the job gets done.

In Matthew 11:30 Jesus says, "For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light." In farming terms, a yoke helps two animals pull something together. When we choose to follow Jesus, He can help us with our trials and everyday problems. Jesus becomes "yoked" to us and helps us when we ask Him to be with us.

How can you help kids understand that they can ask Jesus to help them with their problems? Find something heavy, like a brick or something else in your home. Could they lift it for a whole day, for an hour? In fact, they might find out that the longer they hold it, the heavier it gets!

The same is true of our problems. Maybe you have a friend who isn't being very kind to you. Maybe there is a class you're struggling with. Kids can ask Jesus to help them with all their problems and more!

Trust - Connect - Give Glory! Oak Hill Campus Update

We speak a lot about the Disciple Life at WLC. To discover my identity in Jesus, become more like Him and help others do the same. This is a beautiful picture of what it looks like to grow as disciples of Jesus: people who respond to His invitation to Follow Him.

Being part of this at Oak Hill has been one of the most joy-giving, life-satisfying, Holy Spirit filling, Kingdom advancing experiences of my ministry. But none of it could happen without trust. Trust in God, and trust in His people, namely you. Believing God's Word, "If anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation. The old has gone, the new is here!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). If life is truly better together, and I believe it is, then creating an environment of trust deepens us as a community of believers who are willing to be vulnerable, sharing our stories of transformation and pointing to our great and glorious God who sets captives free. The Apostle Paul gives us an incredible example of this. He never denies what he once was, or what he once did. He uses these things to point to Jesus and declare how awesome He is. "For you have heard of my former life... I persecuted... violently... trying to destroy." (Galatians 1:13) "I was a blasphemer, persecutor and violent aggressor." (1 Timothy1:13) In Acts 22 and 26 the Apostle Paul does not hide his former life but uses it as the platform to point to the power of mercy and grace in Jesus. "Yet I was shown mercy..."

It takes courage to be vulnerable. It also takes people who create a safe place to receive and communicate love and celebrate what God has done. This Fall at Oak Hill we have returned to Wednesdays in the Barn where this kind of courage and vulnerability opened the door for others to share their stories of God's redemptive power to heal, strengthen, and breathe His life into us. I am so proud of Maria Engen, Mark Hogeboom, Tiffany Fitzgerald, and Tim Howard who were willing to share some of their stories and deepen us as a family of Jesus Follow-

ers. But it doesn't stop there. Prayer takes us even deeper in communion with each other and the Holy Spirit.

Our evenings in the Barn conclude with coming together and praying for each other. Sharing our fears, hopes, longings, and needs with each other and offering them all to our Heavenly Father in prayer. I want to challenge you. Financial Report:


